<u>MOTION TO ADOPT</u> Resolution No. 2021-495 directing the County Administrator to publish Notice of Public Hearing to be held on Thursday, November 4, 2021, at 10:00 a.m., in Room 422 of the Governmental Center to consider enactment of a proposed Ordinance, the title of which is as follows:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, PERTAINING TO THE BROWARD COUNTY LIVING WAGE ORDINANCE; AMENDING SECTION 26-101 OF THE BROWARD COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES ("CODE"); AMENDING REQUIREMENTS FOR SKYCAPS AND EMPLOYEES PERFORMING TIP-RELATED PORTER ASSISTANCE SERVICES TO RECEIVE A LIVING WAGE; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Why Action is Necessary

The proposed Ordinance was prepared by the Office of the County Attorney at the direction of the Board of County Commissioners at its meeting of September 21, 2021.

What Action Accomplishes

Enables the setting of a public hearing during which the Board may consider enacting an Ordinance that amends the Living Wage Ordinance to cover skycaps and other tipped employees.

Summary Explanation/Background

This action supports the Board's Value of "Ensuring economic opportunities for Broward's diverse population and businesses."

On September 21, 2021, the Board directed the Office of the County Attorney to draft an amendment to the Broward County Living Wage Ordinance ("Living Wage Ordinance") to require that skycaps (i.e., employees who handle luggage, perform curbside check-in, and work primarily for tips) earn a living wage at the Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport ("Airport"). The Board has a proprietary interest in ensuring safe, secure, seamless, and efficient operations at the Airport. High

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levels of worker turnover, inconsistent and insufficient training, and employee unrest would threaten to undermine this interest. Given the critical economic importance of the Airport and the impact of service workers on security, public health, and passenger satisfaction with the Airport, the proposed expansion of the Living Wage Ordinance furthers the County's proprietary interest. Moreover, the expansion of the Living Wage Ordinance is designed to enable workers to better support and care for their families and to fully participate in Broward County's economic, civic, and cultural experiences.

The proposed Ordinance would expand the living wage requirements to apply to skycaps and employees of airline service providers who perform tip-related porter assistance services, including curbside check-in. The proposed Ordinance also changes the reference from "gratuity" to "tip" to better align with the United States Department of Labor's definitions for "tipped" employees.
