RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA. URGING CURRENT AND POTENTIAL PARTNERS TO AND PRIORITIZE PARTICIPATION IN AND INCREASED FINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR THE REGIONAL **BROWARD** WATER PARTNERSHIP AND CONSERVATION PAYS PROGRAM FOR THE PERIOD OF 2022 THROUGH 2027; DIRECTING THAT A COPY OF THIS RESOLUTION BE DISTRIBUTED AS SET FORTH HEREIN; SEVERABILITY PROVIDING FOR AND EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, clean, high quality water resources are vital to the sustainability of the environment, economy, and quality of life in Broward County;

WHEREAS, the Biscayne Aquifer is the primary source of drinking water for Broward County and most of southeast Florida;

WHEREAS, as a measure for ensuring protection of the Everglades, future withdrawals from the Biscayne Aquifer have been capped, resulting in increases in water demand having to be met with the development of alternative water supplies;

WHEREAS, saltwater intrusion of the Biscayne Aquifer poses an even greater constraint on regional water supplies, with sea level rise substantially accelerating the rate of saltwater intrusion and posing current and future impacts to coastal wellfields and regional water availability;

WHEREAS, the Broward Water Resources Task Force ("WRTF") was created in 2008 to identify and recommend strategies for improved water conservation and cost-effective development of regional alternative water supplies;

WHEREAS, a specific recommendation of the WRTF was the establishment of a regional water conservation and incentives program;

WHEREAS, this recommendation was endorsed by the Broward County Board of County Commissioners and eighteen (18) local municipalities and water providers who committed five (5) years of initial financial support for a regionally coordinated conservation partnership that would later be branded as the Broward Water Partnership;

WHEREAS, Broward County, on behalf of the Broward Water Partnership, contracted with a public relations firm to launch the Conservation Pays Program in October 2011, with a focus on delivering comprehensive water conservation messaging, a communitywide media campaign, and the provision of rebates and incentives to encourage plumbing retrofits with water-efficient devices;

WHEREAS, in just over ten (10) years, the Broward Water Partnership has resulted in more than 17,500 toilet rebates, distribution of 32,600 water-savings devices, and 3.35 billion gallons in annual water savings through plumbing retrofits;

WHEREAS, as a result of the Broward Water Partnership and other regional water conservation initiatives, per capita water demands within Broward County have decreased a total of twenty-five percent (25%) during the last nineteen (19) years;

WHEREAS, increasingly, Broward municipalities and water utilities are including water conservation and sustained investments in water conservation as fundamental to their long-term water supply plans;

WHEREAS, the Broward Water Partnership constitutes an important regional investment in addressing water conservation indoors and through behavioral water conservation changes, in conjunction with other regional water conservation initiatives, including the Regional NatureScape Irrigation Service, the annual Water Matters Day, and Broward County's year-round landscape irrigation measures ordinance;

WHEREAS, in order for the Broward Water Partnership to continue to deliver the benefits of the Conservation Pays Program, Broward County staff recommend a twenty-five percent (25%) increase in the total program budget through joint cost share with current and new partners;

WHEREAS, a twenty-five percent (25%) increase in the total program budget would support renewed contracting for public relations services and media messaging, the distribution of rebates and incentives, and targeted delivery of services for low and moderate income households, a focus deemed vital to the success of the Partnership and that would provide enhanced support for underserved communities; and

WHEREAS, current and new partners are requested to pursue and prioritize participation in, and financial support for, the Broward Water Partnership and Conservation Pays Program at a level necessary for a twenty-five percent (25%) increase in the total program budget through joint cost share agreements, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Section 1. The Broward County Board of County Commissioners hereby encourages current and new partners in the Broward Water Partnership, including Broward County agencies, local municipalities, and water suppliers, to pursue and prioritize participation and enhanced financial support for delivery of the regional Broward Water Partnership and the Conservation Pays Program for the period of 2022 through 2027.
