Recommended Intended Allocation of the Referendum Renewal EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

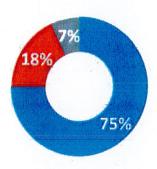
Intended Allocation of Funds that will be generated by the Referendum that will be Held on August 23, 2022, for The School Board of Broward County, FL on a Question Regarding a Levy of Ad-Valorem Taxes for school resource officers, safety staff and mental health professionals, increase compensation to recruit and retain teachers and staff, and essential instruction related expenditures to preserve important programs, for the benefit of all traditional public and charter schools.

On March 15, 2022, The School Board of Broward County, Florida voted to approve a referendum for a question on the August 23, 2022, ballot regarding a levy of ad-valorem taxes for essential operating expenses.

The School Board intends to allocate: (1) 75 percent or more of all available funds for compensation of teachers and eligible staff; (2) up to 18 percent for security (school resource officers and security staff); (3) up to 7 percent for essential programs in our schools, such as additional guidance counselors, social workers, and behavioral staff. Compensation will be subject to collective bargaining. The specific spending plan on school safety and essential programs (mental health) will be finalized after August 23, 2022.

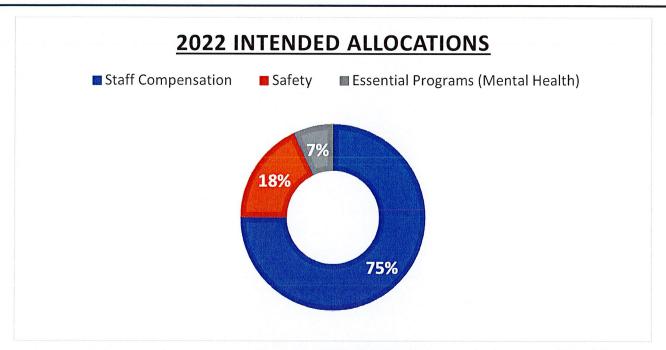
