ABOUT FITCE

The Florida International Trade and Cultural Expo (FITCE) originated in 2015 and was adopted as an annual event by the Broward County Board of County Commissioners in 2016. FITCE is consistent with the Board's Vision of a "vibrant economy with a diverse, skilled workforce, in a county offering unique advantages that attract all types of businesses to create equitable, countywide prosperity" and world-class arts and culture.





HIGHLIGHTS

FITCE 2019 took place on October 9-10, 2019 at the Greater Fort Lauderdale/ Broward County Convention Center, welcoming former heads of state, highlevel representatives of international governments, dignitaries, business delegations and local experts in the field of international trade. FITCE 2019 featured a World Expo Marketplace comprised of 316 international and local exhibitors, as well as an educational component with 15 sessions and panels such as OESBD's signature seminars: 11 Steps to Exporting - A Roadmap to your Exporting Success!, How to Import in the United States, How to Bring your Business to the USA, American and International Buyers Panel and two special segments called Doing Business with the World and Speed Matchmaking with Country Representatives that attracted consulates, trade commissions, bi-national chambers and delegation representatives from 60 countries.



WHY IS FITCE IMPORTANT?

Florida's future is global trade! South Florida's total trade with the world in 2018 was \$107.71 billion in goods sourced in the state, and more than 60,000 companies in the region are registered to export. Now is the time for Broward businesses to move to the next level and Broward County is perfectly positioned to bring new global businesses to the region.




Broward County Cultural Division organized a visual art exhibit which showcased local and international artists demonstrating the community's cultural diversity.


FITCE by the Numbers





FITCE 2019 Financials

Total revenues were \$226,150 originating from sponsorships (\$50,000), Broward County Board of County Commissioner's approved annual budget for FITCE (\$100,000), \$9,460 in revenues originating from the sale of eighty-three (135) local exhibitor tables and \$66,690 from previous years. Total expenses for FITCE 2019 were \$114,161. In addition, the Greater Fort Lauderdale/Broward County Convention Center provided in-kind sponsorship for use of the Floridian Ballroom at the Broward County Convention Center (valued at \$24,027). Below is a consolidated summary report of rounded revenues and expenses.

His Excellency Luis Alberto Lacalle, Former President of Uruguay (1990-1995)

Luis Alberto Lacalle was the President of Uruguay from 1990 to 1995, during which time he encouraged a free market economy and was a co-founder of the Southern Common Market known as Mercosur, along with the presidents of Argentina, Paraguay and Brazil. Additionally, he served two 5-year terms as national senator. In 1993, he was appointed Knight Grand Cross of the Order of St. Michael and St. George by Queen Elizabeth II of England. Active in various international organizations including the Club of Madrid and the Latin American Presidential Mission, he lectures widely and is a columnist for the El Pais newspaper in Montevideo. President Lacalle and his wife, Maria Julia Pou, have 3 children and 5 grandchildren.





His Excellency Luis Guillermo Solís Rivera, Former President of Costa Rica (2014-2018)

In May of 2014, he became the 47th President of the Republic of Costa Rica for a four-year period. Previously, President Solís has held important diplomatic roles including Chef de Cabinet, Ambassador & Special Envoy to Central America, Director General for Policy at the Costa Rican Ministry for Foreign Affairs and Regional Representative of the General Ibero-American Secretariat for Central America and Haiti. He also co-chaired the UN Secretary General's High Level Panel for the Economic Empowerment of Women. During his tenure as a Professor teaching at the University of Costa Rica and a Fullbright Visiting Scholar at the University of Michigan, President Solís authored and co-authored more than 10 books and over 60 scholarly articles in academic publications in Latin America, the US, China and Europe. President Solís today continues his accomplished academic career as a Distinguished Visiting Professor at the Kimberly Green Latin American and Caribbean Center at Florida International University in Miami, Florida, USA.



His Excellency Jamil Mahaud, Former President of Ecuador (1998-2000)

Jamil Mahuad was the President of Ecuador from 1998 to 2000, during which time he instituted economic reform policies focusing on reducing government spending and improving tax collection mechanisms. Also, he signed a historic peace agreement with Peru, resolving long-standing border disputes. Before becoming president, Mr. Mahuad served as Mayor of Quito for six years. Currently, he lectures on ethics and politics at several universities, including Harvard University's John F. Kennedy School of Government. 
