RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA. PROVIDING FOR A REFERENDUM ELECTION TO BE HELD NOVEMBER ON 8. 2022, TO DETERMINE WHETHER TO AMEND SECTION 9.01 OF THE BROWARD COUNTY CHARTER RELATING TO CENTRAL EXAMINING CONSTRUCTION BOARDS FOR TRADES; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

8 WHEREAS, on November 5, 1974, a majority of the electors of Broward County
9 (the County) approved the Broward County Charter (the Charter), which became effective
10 on January 1, 1975;

WHEREAS, Section 9.01 of the Charter establishes the Board of Plumbers, the
Board of General Construction Trades, the Board of Mechanical Contractors and
Specialty Mechanical Contractors, the Board of Engineered Construction Trades, the
Board of Electricians, and the Board of Liquefied Petroleum Gas Contractors, each known
as a Central Examining Board (CEB);

WHEREAS, the CEBs were created to register and license individuals who perform
various construction trades in the County, to ensure those individuals are qualified and
properly insured, and to provide the public a means to register complaints, mediate
disputes, and be heard with respect to issues that arise during construction;

WHEREAS, Chapter 2021-214 of the Laws of Florida (the Act) enacted by the Florida Legislature in 2021 expressly preempts the licensing of occupations to the state, and effective July 1, 2023, local licensing of an occupation that is not authorized under the Act or otherwise authorized by general law may not be enforced;

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WHEREAS, due to the significant reduction in the type and volume of licenses
issued by the CEBs that will result when the Act becomes fully effective July 1, 2023, the
Broward County Board of County Commissioners (the Board) wishes to eliminate the
Liquefied Petroleum Gas Contractors CEB and consolidate the remaining five CEBs into
one CEB, consisting of two (2) Divisions, and otherwise amend the Charter to ensure
consistency with the Act and to provide for the efficient regulation of construction trades
that remains permissible under the Act;

8 WHEREAS, Section 2.06 of the Charter authorizes the Board to propose
9 amendments and revisions to the Charter, subject to referendum of the general
10 electorate; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to place a referendum before the voters at the November 8, 2022, General Election that, if approved, would amend Section 9.01 of the Charter to eliminate the Liquefied Petroleum Gas Contractors CEB and consolidate the remaining five CEBs into a single CEB to serve the purposes for which the CEBs were originally created, to the extent permissible under, and in a manner consistent with, the Act, NOW, THEREFORE,

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18 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF19 BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:

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Section 1. Subject to an affirmative vote of the general electorate, Section 9.01
of the Charter of Broward County, Florida, entitled "Central Examining Boards," is hereby
amended, effective July 1, 2023, to read as follows:

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Sec. 9.01. Central examining boards.

2 The Central Examining Boards ("CEBs"), with two (2) Divisions, are is Α. created in order to provide for procedures to register and license individuals who perform 3 a variety of construction trades in the County, to issue Certificates of Competency to 4 individuals practicing the various construction trades in the County, to ensure that 5 6 individuals practicing the various construction trades are properly insured, and to provide 7 the public a means by which to register complaints, mediate disputes, and to be heard with respect to issues which that arise during construction. 8

9 B. For purposes of this aArticle, a "Professional Member" shall be an individual who has been active in his/her respective craft or trade for not less than ten (10) years 10 within the County. 11

C. For purposes of this Article, a "Consumer Representative" shall be any 12 13 person who resides in the County who is not, and has never been, a member or practitioner of a profession regulated by the board <u>CEB</u> or a member of any closely related 14 15 profession.

16 D. The Board of Plumbers, Board of General Construction Trades, Board of Mechanical Contractors and Specialty Mechanical Contractors, and Board of Engineered 17 18 Construction Trades are established as County CEBs, and each CEB shall consist of 19 eighteen (18) members, comprised of the members of Division I and Division II. Division I of the CEB shall consist of nine (9) members and nine (9) alternates. These This 20 21 nine-member CEBs Division shall be comprised of five (5) members, and five (5) 22 alternates appointed by the County Commission, consisting of three (3) Professional 23 Members, three (3) Professional Member alternates, two (2) Consumer Representatives, 24 and two (2) Consumer Representative alternates. The Broward County League of Cities

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1 shall appoint four (4) members, and four (4) alternates, consisting of three (3)
2 Professional Members, and three (3) Professional Member alternates, and one (1)
3 Consumer Representative, and one (1) Consumer Representative alternate. The County
4 Commission and League of Cities Professional Member appointments shall each consist
5 of two (2) Professional Members and two (2) Professional Member alternates in the
6 general construction trade, and one (1) Professional Member and one (1) Professional
7 Member alternate in the engineered construction trade.

8 E. The Board of Electricians CEB is established, and shall consist of seven (7) members, and seven (7) alternates. The County Commission shall appoint four (4) 9 10 members, and four (4) alternates, consisting of three (3) Professional Members, three (3) Professional Member alternates, and one (1) Consumer Representative, and one (1) 11 12 Consumer Representative alternate. The Broward County League of Cities shall appoint 13 three (3) members, and three (3) alternates, consisting of three (3) Professional Members and three (3) Professional Member alternates. Division II of the CEB shall consist of 14 15 nine (9) members and nine (9) alternates. This nine-member Division shall be comprised 16 of five (5) members and five (5) alternates appointed by the County Commission, 17 consisting of three (3) Professional Members, three (3) Professional Member alternates, 18 two (2) Consumer Representatives, and two (2) Consumer Representative alternates. 19 The Broward County League of Cities shall appoint four (4) members and four (4) alternates, consisting of three (3) Professional Members, three (3) Professional Member 20 21 alternates, one (1) Consumer Representative, and one (1) Consumer Representative 22 alternate. The County Commission and League of Cities Professional Member 23 appointments shall consist of one (1) Professional Member and one (1) Professional

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Member alternate in each of the following trades: electrical contracting, mechanical
 contracting, and plumbing contracting.

F. The Board of Liquefied Petroleum Gas Contractors CEB is established, and
shall consist of six (6) members, and six (6) alternates. The County Commission shall
appoint three (3) Professional Members and three (3) Professional Member alternates.
The Broward County League of Cities shall appoint three (3) Professional Members, and
three (3) Professional Member alternates.

G. F. Each of the individuals appointed by the County Commission to each the
CEB shall be nominated by a Commissioner, and approved by a majority of the County
Commission. The County Commission shall adopt an appointment process which that
provides for the appointment of Professional Members, Consumer Representatives, and
alternates to the CEBs. Once appointed, the members appointed by the County
Commission shall serve until the expiration of their term for a term of four (4) years, or
until a successor is duly appointed.

H. <u>G.</u> The CEB members appointed by the Broward County League of Cities shall
serve for a term of four (4) years, or until a successor is duly appointed.

17 I. <u>H.</u> All Members of the CEBs may serve up to three (3) consecutive four-year
18 terms.

J. <u>I.</u> The County Commission or the Broward County League of Cities,
whichever is the appointing authority, may remove, either by its own action or upon
recommendation of the majority of the members of the respective <u>Division of the</u> CEB,
any member or alternate for misconduct, incompetence, or neglect of duty.

23K. J.Any vacancy occurring on a the CEB shall be filled for the remainder of the24former member's term of office by appointment of the County Commission, when the

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former member was a County Commission appointee, or by the Broward County League
 of Cities, when the former member was a Broward County League of Cities appointee.

3 L. <u>K.</u> As to its respective craft or trade, each <u>The</u> CEB shall have the powers and
4 duties to:

- 5 (1) Ssubmit to the County Commission rules and regulations with regard to the
 6 requirements for the issuance and revocation of eCertificates of
 7 eCompetency. The County Commission shall enact the rules and
 8 regulations by ordinance-;
- 9 (2) <u>Ccontract with independent testing services to compose, administer, and</u>
 10 grade tests given for the purpose of granting <u>cCertificates of <u>cCompetency</u>
 11 to individuals practicing specific crafts and trades. A testing agency which
 12 <u>that</u> contracts with the County shall not, through itself or any subsidiary,
 13 offer instructions to applicants for the purpose of passing the tests-; and
 </u>
- A<u>a</u>dopt reasonable fees to be paid by applicants to cover the costs of the
 respective CEBs, including administrative staff to be provided by the County
 Administrator.

17 M. L. Certificates of Competency as provided in the laws of the State of Florida.
18 which are issued by each the CEB created hereunder, shall be valid countywide.

N. M. After adoption of this provision, Municipalities shall not issue new
eCertificates of eCompetency based on examination in any of the above trades or crafts
for which the CEB issues Certificates of Competency. Municipalities may renew those
certificates of competency previously issued by the Municipalities between
October 1, 1975, and the adoption of this provision.

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O. N. Each The CEB and each of its Divisions shall be supplied office space by
 the County and. Each Division shall meet a minimum of eight (8) six (6) times a year. The
 CEB shall meet as it deems necessary.

P. The Liquefied Petroleum Gas Contractors CEB shall only be required to
meet a minimum of four (4) times a year. In the event that any person requests to be
heard by the Liquefied Petroleum Gas Contractors CEB on any matter, other than a
complaint of a violation of Chapter 9 of the County Code, as amended, the Liquefied
Petroleum Gas Contractors CEB shall meet to consider such matter no later than thirty
(30) days after receipt of the request to be heard from the applicant.

10 Q. O. All c<u>C</u>ertificates of c<u>C</u>ompetency issued by the CEBs prior to the adoption
11 of this Section November 2, 1976, shall remain in full force and effect unless <u>otherwise</u>
12 prohibited by law or revoked for cause.

13 R. P. The County Attorney shall represent each of the CEBs and each of its
14 <u>Divisions</u>.

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Section 2. A referendum election is called for the General Election on
November 8, 2022, and at such other times as permitted for voting under Chapter 101,
Florida Statutes, to determine whether to amend Section 9.01 of the Broward County
Charter relating to Central Examining Boards for construction trades.

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Section 3. In accordance with Section 100.342, Florida Statutes, at least
thirty (30) days' notice of the referendum election shall be published by the County
Administrator in a newspaper of general circulation in Broward County. The publication
shall be made at least twice, including once in the fifth week and once in the third week

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prior to the week in which the referendum is to be held. The notice is hereby attached as
 Exhibit A and made a part hereof.

Section 4. Said referendum election shall be held between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 8, 2022, and at such other days and times as provided under applicable law, including early voting as provided by Section 101.657, Florida Statutes, at polling places established in Broward County. All registered and qualified electors in Broward County shall be eligible to vote in the referendum election. Vote-by-mail ballots and early voting access for the referendum shall be made available as provided by law.

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Section 5. The election boards consisting of the clerks and inspectors
appointed to serve for the November 8, 2022, General Election are hereby appointed to
serve in the referendum election in the manner provided by law.

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Section 6. The Broward County Canvassing Board shall canvass the returns insaid election and shall certify the results of the referendum election as provided by law.

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Section 7. The County Administrator shall furnish a certified copy of this
Resolution to the Supervisor of Elections for Broward County promptly upon adoption by
the Board.

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Section 8. The title and summary of the referendum item to appear on the
General Election on November 8, 2022, as embodied in this enabling Resolution, shall
be as follows:

15	legally applied to any individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such		
16	6 determination will not affect the applicability of this Resolution to any other individual,		
17	group, entity, property, or circumstance. If the County determines any part of the ballot		
18	statement is contrary to state law, the County Attorney is authorized to request that the		
19	Supervisor of Elections remove the applicable language from the proposed ballot		
20	proposal and the Supervisor of Elections is authorized to remove such language.

The referendum shall be held on November 8, 2022, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m., and at such other days and times as provided under applicable law, including for early voting as provided by Section 101.657, Florida Statutes, at the polling places established in Broward County. All registered and qualified electors of Broward County shall be eligible to vote in said referendum election. Vote-by-mail ballots for the referendum election shall be prepared and made available as provided by law.

The Broward County Canvassing Board shall canvass the returns and certify the results of the referendum election to the Board of County Commissioners of Broward County, Florida, the Broward County Administrator, and the Florida Department of State, to be recorded and filed in appropriate public records.
