2	AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY			
3	COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, CREATING A POLICE AND CRIMINAL JUSTICE REVIEW			
4	BOARD; CREATING SECTION 18-7 OF THE BROWARD COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES ("CODE");			
5	AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, INCLUSIÓN IN THÉ CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.			
6	(Sponsored by Mayor Dale V.C. Holness)

8	WHEREAS, on May 25, 2020, George Perry Floyd, Jr., was killed when a			
9	Minneapolis police officer knelt on his neck for approximately eight (8) minutes, despite			
10	Mr. Floyd repeatedly informing the officer-more than twenty (20) times-that he was			
11	unable to breathe;			
12	WHEREAS, the death of George Floyd was witnessed by multiple onlookers who			
13	were prevented from intervening, and video of the tragedy was recorded by multiple			
14	persons including by police officers on their own body cameras;			
15	WHEREAS, the injustice of George Floyd's death has sparked national and			
16	international outrage and fueled demand for better oversight of police use of force and			
17	misconduct;			
18	WHEREAS, the authority of Broward County (the "County") to independently			
19	investigate specific incidents of police misconduct or use of force for disciplinary purposes			
20	is statutorily limited in some respects; however, nothing in State law prohibits the County			
21	from investigating general trends, practices, and patterns in policing, including with regard			
22	to the use of force; and			
23	WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Broward County, Florida (the			
24	"Board"), finds that creation of an independent Police and Criminal Justice Review Board			
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to gather and publish information on trends, practices, and patterns in policing, including 1 2 regarding the use of force, and to bring forward advice and insights to inform law 3 enforcement policymaking, is appropriate at this time, 4 5 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA: 6 7 8 Section 1. Section 18-7 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby 9 created to read as follows: 10 [Underlining omitted] Sec. 18-7. Broward County Police and Criminal Justice Review Board 11 Definitions. 12 (a) The following terms and phases, when used in this article, shall have the meaning 13 ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different 14 meaning. Words used in the present tense shall include the future, and the singular 15 number includes the plural, and the plural, the singular. 16 17 County Commission means the Board of County Commissioners of Broward County, Florida. 18 Police agencies means the Broward Sheriff's Office, including both law 19 20 enforcement and correctional functions, and municipal police departments, however denominated, within the geographic boundaries of Broward County. 21 22 Review Board means the Broward County Police and Criminal Justice Review 23 Board created by this section. 24

19	Board Administrator to serve as the Review Board's primary staff support, and to				
20 21	supervise such other staff as the County Administrator may provide. The Review Board				
	Administrator shall report to the County Administrator or designee. The Review Board				
22	may request that the County Commission provide such other fact-finding and research				
23	personnel as the Review Board may determine are necessary from time to time.				
24	(f)	Functions. The Review Board shall publish data compilations and reports			
24	and make recommendations regarding policy to the County Commission on the subjects				
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of police use of force, police misconduct, and such other matters pertaining to bias in the 1 criminal justice system as the Review Board determines appropriate and its resources 2 3 permit. The Review Board Administrator and appropriate staff as designated by the County Administrator shall be tasked with providing research, statistical, and other 4 administrative support for the Review Board. The Review Board Administrator shall bear 5 primary responsibility for gathering and analyzing data, drafting reports, and providing 6 general administrative support for the Review Board. The Review Board shall be 7 responsible for determining what policy recommendations, if any, to make to the County 8 Commission, including based upon the data obtained and analyses conducted by the 9 10 Review Board Administrator.

The Review Board Administrator and staff shall compile data as requested 11 (1) by the Review Board. Such data shall include information contained in 12 13 databases and reports from police agencies concerning police use of force and allegations of police misconduct, including but not limited to completed 14 internal investigations. Such data may also include information regarding 15 arrests from each police agency and data regarding bail and sentencing 16 17 from Florida's 17th Judicial Circuit or other applicable sources, to the extent 18 data is available. At the Review Board's direction, the Review Board 19 Administrator may compile additional data relevant to the Review Board's 20 objectives.

- (2) The Review Board Administrator shall make publicly available, including by
 publication on the County website, statistical data compiled from the police
 agencies and other sources.
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1	(3)	At least once per year every six months, the Review Board shall publish a	
2	report summarizing the preceding year'six months' data and analyzing any		
3	trends or patterns observed. These reports may describe specific incidents		
4		for the purpose of illustrating systemic problems.	
5	(g)	(g) <i>Objectives.</i> The objectives of the Review Board are to identify and report	
6	on systemic issues of related to policing <u>and the criminal justice system</u> , including but not		
7	limited to:		
8	(1)	Patterns of police misconduct, use of force, misuse of position,	
9		over-policing, arrest rates, charging decisions, bail terms, or sentencing that	
10		may indicate disparities based on race or other factors; and	
11	(2)	Repeated incidents of misconduct or improper use of force within the same	
12		police agency, agency subunit, or geographical area.	
13	The Review Board is not tasked with investigation of specific incidents of alleged police		
14	misconduct or misuse of force.		
15	(h)	Powers. In order to achieve its objectives, the Review Board shall have the	
16	authority to:		
17	(<u>1)</u>	Make recommendations regarding current and proposed police agency	
18		policies, procedures, and practices on matters including, but not limited to	
19	_	training, recruitment, and disciplinary procedures.	
20	<u>(2)</u>	Hold public hearings, make factual determinations, draw conclusions,	
21		propose recommendations, and prepare interim and final reports on matters	
22		relating to the Review Board's objectives and functions.	
23	<u>(3)</u>	Demand, examine, and duplicate public records and documents in	
24		accordance with the provisions of Chapter 119, Florida Statutes.

(4) Request any person to give sworn testimony before the Review Board or to 1 2 produce documentary or other evidence, to the extent permitted by 3 applicable law. (5) 4 Issue subpoenas for witnesses, documents, and other potential evidence 5 for all matters within the Review Board's jurisdiction, except as may be 6 prohibited by applicable law. (i) 7 Complaints. The Review Board and the Review Board Administrator may 8 assist members of the public in determining how to make a complaint to a specific law enforcement agency and may request a copy of the response from the particular agency. 9 10 Any complaint received by the Review Board pertaining to a law enforcement or correctional officer shall be provided within five (5) business days after receipt to the 11 employing agency of the officer pursuant to Section 112.533(1)(b), Florida Statutes. 12 Sunset. Section 18-7 shall automatically sunset on December 31, 202530, 13 (i) (j) unless reauthorized by the County Commission. 14 Section 2. 15 Severability. If any portion of this Ordinance is determined by any court to be invalid, the invalid 16 17 portion will be stricken, and such striking will not affect the validity of the remainder of this 18 Ordinance. If any court determines that this Ordinance, in whole or in part, cannot be 19 legally applied to any individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such 20 determination will not affect the applicability of this Ordinance to any other individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance. 21 22 Section 3. Inclusion in the Broward County Code of Ordinances. 23 It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners that the provisions of this Ordinance become part of the Broward County Code of Ordinances as of the effective 24

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1	date. The sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered and the word			
2	"ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or such other appropriate word or			
3	phrase to the extent necessary in order to accomplish such intention.			
4	Section 4. <u>Effective Date</u> .			
5	This Ordinance is effective as of the date provided by law.
