| 9 | WHEREAS, Section 2.06 of the Broward County Charter ("Charter") authorizes the | | |
| 10 | Broward County Board of County Commissioners ("Board") to propose amendments and | | |
| 11 | revisions to the Charter, subject to referendum of the general electorate; | | |
| 12 | WHEREAS, pursuant to Article VIII, Section 1 of the Florida Constitution, the voters | | |
| 13 | of Broward County have the constitutional right to determine the form of Broward County's | | |
| 14 | governmental structure, which includes the authority to increase or decrease the size of | | |
| 15 | the Board, establish Charter offices, and grant such powers to County Commissioners | | |
| 16 | and Charter officers as the voters deem appropriate; | | |
| 17 | WHEREAS, the Board desires to place an amendment to the Charter before the | | |
| 18 | voters at the November 8, 2022, General Election; | | |
| 19 | WHEREAS, the proposed amendment would change the Office of Mayor from | | |
| 20 | being Commission-elected on an annual basis to being a new countywide Charter | | |
| 21 | position elected on a partisan basis for a four-year term; | | |
| 22 | WHEREAS, Broward County's voters should have the opportunity to exercise their | | |
| 23 | right to decide whether the entire County should elect the Mayor of Broward County, with | | |

WHEREAS, if the position of Broward County Mayor should ever become vacant for any reason, it is the will of the Board, and if this proposal is approved by the voters, the will of the residents of Broward County, that the position lapse until the next scheduled general election, and that pending such election the duties of Mayor be automatically transferred to and performed by the Vice-Mayor or such other member of the Board that the Board selects, NOW, THEREFORE,

9 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF10 BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Section 1. Subject to an affirmative vote of the general electorate, Section 2.01
of the Charter of Broward County, Florida, entitled "Composition, redistricting, terms,
qualifications, and compensation of members," is hereby amended, effective
November 5, 2024 (except that Section 2.01 shall govern with respect to the qualifying
for and the holding of the primary and general elections for Mayor in 2024), to read as
follows:

Sec. 2.01. Composition, redistricting, terms, qualifications, and
compensation of members.

The County Commission comprises the Legislative Branch of County government empowered to enact ordinances and resolutions, and to take action that is consistent with this Charter and that is in the best interest of the health, safety, and welfare of the County's citizens. <u>For purposes of this section only, the term "Commissioner(s)" does not include</u> the Mayor.

3 Following the election of the Mayor, tThe County Commission shall elect a В. А. Commissioner to the position of Vice-Mayor by a majority vote during the County 4 5 Commission's annual organizational meeting, which shall take place no earlier than the 6 third Tuesday of each November and no later than the third Tuesday of each December. 7 In the Mayor's absence, the Vice-Mayor shall have all the rights, privileges, and duties of 8 the Mayor, except that the Vice-Mayor shall not be subject to Section 2.01.F. of the 9 Charter and shall receive the same salary as other County Commissioners. The County 10 Commission may remove the individual from the position of Vice-Mayor by a majority 11 vote. The Vice-Mayor may serve consecutive terms.

12 In the event the position of Mayor shall become vacant for any reason, the С. В. 13 Vice-Mayor shall automatically become Mayor and serve as Mayor for the balance of the Mayor's term. The Commission shall elect a new Vice-Mayor who shall serve for the 14 15 balance of the Mayor's term. If the Office of Mayor lapses pursuant to Section 2.01.A. of 16 the Charter, all duties and powers of the Office arising under the Charter, Florida Statutes, 17 Broward County Ordinance, and the Broward County Administrative Code shall 18 automatically be transferred on a temporary basis to the Vice-Mayor until such time as a 19 Mayor is elected pursuant to Section 2.01 of the Charter. During the period in which the 20 Vice-Mayor has the duties and powers of the Office of Mayor, the Vice-Mayor's service 21 shall be treated as continuous service as a Commissioner for purposes of term limitation 22 provisions, Section 2.01.F of the Charter shall not apply, and the Vice-Mayor shall 23 continue to receive the same salary as any other County Commissioner. If, for any 24 reason, the duties of Mayor are being performed by anyone not elected in a countywide

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election to the position of Mayor, the Board of County Commissioners may transfer the
Mayor's powers and duties to another member of the County Commission, and during
such period such Commissioner's service shall be treated as continuous service as a
Commissioner for purposes of term limitation provisions, Section 2.01.F of the Charter
shall not apply, and the Commissioner shall continue to receive the same salary as the
other County Commissioners.

D. C. In the event <u>If</u> the position of Vice-Mayor shall become vacant for any
reason, or the Vice-Mayor is performing the duties of Mayor pursuant to Section 2.03.B.
of the Charter, the <u>County</u> Commission shall <u>select a County Commissioner to perform</u>
the duties of Vice-Mayor new Vice-Mayor who shall serve for the balance of the
Vice-Mayor's term <u>or the period during which the Vice-Mayor is performing the duties of</u>
Mayor, whichever is shorter.

13 D. Except for the temporary performance of the Mayor's duties pursuant to this 14 section, if anyone is ever appointed to the Office of Mayor to fill a vacancy; or upon final 15 judicial determination, including all appeals, that under Florida law any vacancy in the 16 Office of Mayor must be filled by appointment, the amendment to the Broward County 17 Charter establishing such Office of Mayor, approved November 8, 2022, shall be 18 automatically, permanently, and irrevocably void in its entirety and the structure of 19 Broward County Board of County Commissioners shall return to the structure that existed 20 as of November 7, 2022.

Section 4. Subject to an affirmative vote of the general electorate, Section 2.04
of the Charter of Broward County, Florida, entitled "Mayor – Duties and responsibilities,"
is hereby amended, effective November 8, 2024, to read as follows:

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Sec. 2.04. Mayor – Duties and responsibilities.

The position <u>Office</u> of Mayor is created <u>as a Charter Office</u> in order to provide for
an elected County representative who shall serve as the County's official representative
and ceremonial dignitary, and who shall provide leadership on issues facing the County.

5 The Mayor shall be recognized as the head of the County by the Governor Α. 6 for purposes of military law, and for service of process. Unless the County Commission 7 designates another member of the County Commission, <u>Tthe Mayor shall act as the</u> 8 County official designated to represent the County in negotiations with respect to agreements with other governmental entities, execute ordinances, resolutions, 9 proclamations, and other legislative documents, and perform such other duties as 10 specified in this Charter and as may be required by the County Commission, or as 11 12 required by law.

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Section 5. A referendum election is called for the General Election on
November 8, 2022, and at such other times as permitted for voting under Chapter 101,
Florida Statutes, to determine whether the Broward County Charter should be amended
to create a Mayor elected countywide.

Section 6. In accordance with Section 100.342, Florida Statutes, at least thirty
(30) days' notice of the referendum election shall be published by the Broward County
Administrator in a newspaper of general circulation in Broward County. The publication
shall be made at least twice, including once in the fifth week and once in the third week
prior to the week in which the referendum is to be held. The notice is hereby attached as
Exhibit A and made a part hereof.

6 It is estimated that this amendment would result in a financial impact of additional7 costs in the amount of approximately \$707,000 per year.

Section 12. Severability.

9 If any portion of this Resolution is determined by any court to be invalid, the invalid 10 portion will be stricken, and such striking will not affect the validity of the remainder of this 11 Resolution, unless a court finds that the Office of Mayor may be filled by appointment by 12 the Governor of the State of Florida resulting from a vacancy or lapse in the Office, in 13 which event it is the intent of the Board that this Amendment shall be deemed invalid in 14 its entirety. If any court determines that this Resolution, in whole or in part, cannot be 15 legally applied to any individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such 16 determination will not affect the applicability of this Resolution to any other individual, 17 group, entity, property, or circumstance. If the County determines any part of the ballot 18 statement, including the fiscal impact statement, is contrary to state law, the County 19 Attorney is authorized to request that the Supervisor of Elections remove the applicable 20 language from the proposed ballot proposal and the Supervisor of Elections is authorized 21 to remove such language.

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
