2	A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY			
3	COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, PROVIDING FOR A REFERENDUM			
4	ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 8, 2022, THE DATE OF THE GENERAL ELECTION, TO DETERMINE WHETHER TO AMEND THE BROWARD			
5	COUNTY CHARTER TO PROVIDE FOR A COUNTYWIDE ELECTED MAYOR; AND PROVIDING			
6	FOR SEVERABILITY AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

9	WHEREAS, Section 2.06 of the Broward County Charter ("Charter") authorizes the			
10	Broward County Board of County Commissioners ("Board") to propose amendments and			
11	revisions to the Charter, subject to referendum of the general electorate;			
12	WHEREAS, pursuant to Article VIII, Section 1 of the Florida Constitution, the voters			
13	of Broward County have the constitutional right to determine the form of Broward County's			
14	governmental structure, which includes the authority to increase or decrease the size of			
15	the Board, establish Charter offices, and grant such powers to County Commissioners			
16	and Charter officers as the voters deem appropriate;			
17	WHEREAS, the Board desires to place an amendment to the Charter before the			
18	voters at the November 8, 2022, General Election;			
19	WHEREAS, the proposed amendment would change the Office of Mayor from			
20	being Commission-elected on an annual basis to being a new countywide Charter			
21	position elected on a partisan basis for a four-year two-year term;			
22	WHEREAS, Broward County's voters should have the opportunity to exercise their			
23	right to decide whether the entire County should elect the Mayor of Broward County, with

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A. The County Commission shall be composed of nine (9) ten (10) members elected from single-member districts. nine (9) Commissioners elected from single-member districts; and one (1) Mayor elected at large. If the Office of Mayor ever lapses due to the existence of a vacancy, the County Commission shall be composed of nine (9) members from single-member districts.

- (5) Beginning with the 2024 General Election, the Mayor shall be elected at large, and shall serve for a term of four (4) two (2) years. The Mayor must be a County elector and resident.
- Should there be a vacancy (as defined by Article X, Section 3 of the Florida

  Constitution) in the Office of Mayor, the position shall automatically lapse
  and the Office shall be deemed recreated so it may be filled for a new
  four-year two-year term in the next general election cycle. If no candidate
  qualifies during a general election cycle, the position shall be filled in the
  general election cycle occurring two (2) years later.
- B. Commissioners <u>and the Mayor</u> shall be elected on a partisan basis. The terms of office <u>for both Commissioners and the Mayor</u> shall begin on the Tuesday two (2) weeks following the day of the general election.
- C. Except as provided in this Section, election of Commissioners <u>and the Mayor</u> shall be as provided in Article VIII, Section 1(e), of the Florida Constitution.
- D. The Commissioners' salaries shall be determined and established in accordance with the general law of the State of Florida pertaining to compensation for Commissioners of non-charter counties. The Mayor's salary shall be \$220,000 for the 2025 fiscal year (prorated for the first year), and for every fiscal year thereafter shall

Commissioner office," is hereby amended, effective November 8, 2024, to read as follows:

#### Sec. 2.02. Term limitation for County Commissioner office.

Effective with the terms of the Commissioners that commenced in November 2000, aAn individual shall not be eligible for election as a Commissioner for more than three consecutive four-year terms. Service as a Commissioner prior to the terms that commenced in November 2000 shall not be considered in applying the term limitations of this Section. An individual shall not be eligible for election as Mayor for more than two four consecutive four-year two-year terms. Service of a two-year term, or any other partial term—subsequent to November 2000, shall not be considered in applying the term limitation provisions of this Section. For purposes of this section, the offices of Mayor and County Commissioner shall be considered separate offices, and service as the Mayor or County Commissioner shall not be considered when applying the term limitation provisions in this section to the other office.

Section 3. Subject to an affirmative vote of the general electorate, Section 2.03 of the Charter of Broward County, Florida, entitled "Commission election of Mayor and Vice-Mayor," is hereby amended, effective November 8, 2024, to read as follows:

#### Sec. 2.03. Commission election of Mayor and Vice-Mayor.

A. The County Commission shall elect one (1) Commissioner to the position of Mayor by a majority vote. The election of the Mayor shall occur on an annual basis, during the County Commission's annual organizational meeting, which shall take place no earlier than the third Tuesday of each November and no later than the third Tuesday

Florida Statutes, at the polling places established in Broward County. All registered and qualified electors in Broward County shall be eligible to vote in the referendum election. Vote-by-mail ballots and early voting access for the referendum shall be made available as provided by law.

Section 8. The election boards consisting of the clerks and inspectors appointed to serve for the November 8, 2022, General Election are hereby appointed to serve in the referendum election in the manner provided by law.

Section 9. The Broward County Canvassing Board shall canvass the returns in said election and shall certify the results of the referendum election as provided by law.

Section 10. The County Administrator shall furnish a certified copy of this adopted Resolution to the Supervisor of Elections for Broward County promptly upon adoption by the Board.

Section 11. The title and summary of the referendum question to appear on the November 8, 2022, General Election, as embodied in this enabling Resolution, shall be as follows:

#### **BROWARD COUNTY MAYOR ELECTED AT LARGE**

"Shall the Broward County Charter be amended to provide a Charter Office of Broward County Mayor, to be elected at large starting with the 2024 General Election, with (1) the Mayor exercising such powers as granted by the Charter, (2) annual compensation of \$220,000, adjusted annually for inflation, (3) no person eligible to serve as Mayor for more than two four consecutive four-year terms, and (4) a prohibition on outside employment while serving as Mayor?"
