4	REDUCE THE NUMBER OF PEOPLE WITH MENTAL ILLNESSES IN JAIL; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.	
5	EFFECTIVE DATE.	
6	WHEREAS, an estimated 2 million people with serious mental illnesses are	
7	booked into jails each year; and	
8	WHEREAS, prevalence rates of serious mental illnesses in jails are three to six	
9	times higher than for the general population; and	
10	WHEREAS, almost three-quarters of adults with serious mental illnesses in jails	
11	have co-occurring substance use disorders; and	
12	WHEREAS, adults with mental illnesses tend to stay longer in jail and upon	
13	release are at a higher risk of recidivism than people without these disorders; and	
14	WHEREAS, county jails spend two or three times more on adults with mental	
15	illnesses that require interventions compared to those without these treatment needs;	
16	and	
17	WHEREAS, without the appropriate treatment and services, people with mental	
18	illnesses continue to cycle through the criminal justice system, often resulting in tragic	
19	outcomes for these individuals and their families; and	
20	WHEREAS, Broward County takes pride in its responsibility to protect and	
21	enhance the health, wealth, welfare, and safety of its residents in efficient and cost-	
22	effective ways; and	
23	WHEREAS, the Stepping Up Initiative urges counties to:	
24		

 convene to draw on a diverse team of leaders and decision-makers from multiple agencies committed to safely reducing the number of people with mental illnesses in jails;

- collect and review prevalence numbers and assess individuals' needs to better
 identify adults entering jails with mental illnesses and their recidivism risk, and
 use that baseline information to guide decision making at the system, program,
 and case levels;
- examine treatment and service capacity to determine which programs and services are available in the county for people with mental illnesses and cooccurring substance use disorders, and identify state and local policy and funding barriers to minimizing contact with the justice system and providing treatment and supports in the community;
- develop a plan with measurable outcomes that draws on the jail assessment and
 prevalence data and the examination of available treatment and service capacity,
 while considering identified barriers;
- implement evidence-based practices that advance the plan; and
- create a process to track progress using data and information systems, and to
 report on successes; and

WHEREAS, through Stepping Up, the National Association of Counties, the
Council of State Governments Justice Center, and the American Psychiatric Foundation
are encouraging public, private, and nonprofit partners to reduce the number of people
with mental illnesses in jails; and

23 WHEREAS, Broward County is committed to helping those mental illness and 24 substance abuse problems through programs like those of the Broward Addiction

1	Recovery Center, which provides a wide array of substance abuse detoxification and
2	treatment services to Broward County adults, NOW, THEREFORE,
3	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF

5	Section 1. The aforementioned "Whereas" clauses are hereby ratified and
6	incorporated into this Resolution.
7	Section 2. The Broward County Board of County Commissioners joins the Call
8	to Action to reduce the number of people with mental illnesses in our county jail, and
9	encourages county officials, employees, and residents to participate in Stepping Up.
10	Section 3. <u>EFFECTIVE DATE</u> .
11	This Resolution shall become effective upon adoption.
