| 8 | WHEREAS, Section 22 ¹ / ₂ -6D of the Broward County Code of Ordinances ("Code") | |
| 9 | provides that motor carriers may not engage in business at Port Everglades without first | |
| 10 | obtaining a Port Everglades Motor Carrier Business Permit ("Business Permit"); | |
| 11 | WHEREAS, the Code provides for a term of one (1) year for such Business | |
| 12 | Permits, at fees set by the Board of County Commissioners ("Board") by resolution; | |
| 13 | WHEREAS, the COVID-19 emergency resulted in a halt to cruise traffic at | |
| 14 | Port Everglades, which has continued for over one (1) year; | |
| 15 | WHEREAS, as a result of the halt to cruise traffic, motor carriers that had paid for | |
| 16 | a Business Permit could not pick up passengers at Port Everglades for a majority of the | |
| 17 | period during which the Business Permit was valid; | |
| 18 | WHEREAS, the Code does not provide for exceptions or waivers of Business | |
| 19 | Permit fees, even during an emergency that results in Port Everglades being closed to | |
| 20 | cruise ship passengers; and | |
| 21 | WHEREAS, the Board desires to provide for flexibility to waive Business Permit | |
| 22 | fees or modify expiration dates in the event of a declared state or local emergency, | |

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Section 1. Section 22¹/₂-6D of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is
 hereby amended to read as follows:

3 Sec. 22¹/₂-6D. Port Everglades—Business permits.

(h) The Business Permit initial application processing fee is a nonrefundable
fee assessed the first time an application is made to the County for a permit, except as
hereinafter provided. Business Permit holders who allow their permits to expire shall
reapply and pay the initial processing fee. Such fee will not be refunded if a permit
application is denied, not renewed, suspended, or revoked by the County for any reason.

- 10 (1) In addition, a nonrefundable annual Business Permit fee is assessed for
 11 each calendar year as set forth in the Broward County Administrative Code.
- 12 (2) Business Permits shall be issued on an annual basis and shall expire <u>on</u>
 13 June 30 each year. Fees will not be prorated.
- 14 (3) <u>The Board, by resolution, may waive, prorate, or modify fees or extend or</u>
 15 <u>modify the expiration date of Business Permits during a declared state or</u>
 16 <u>local emergency.</u>

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Section 2. <u>Severability</u>.

If any portion of this Ordinance is determined by any court to be invalid, the invalid
portion will be stricken, and such striking will not affect the validity of the remainder of this
Ordinance. If any court determines that this Ordinance, in whole or in part, cannot be
legally applied to any individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such
determination will not affect the applicability of this Ordinance to any other individual,
group, entity, property, or circumstance.
