<b>Technical Assistance Comment</b>	Even though unincorporated Broward County contains limited coastal lands, in order to be in full compliance with Section 163.3178(2)(f)4 and 5., F.S. the County should consider revising the amendment to add policies , or modify existing ones, to specifically state that any development or redevelopment in the coastal area shall “be consistent with, or more stringent than, the flood resistant construction requirements in the Florida Building Code and applicable flood plain management regulations set forth in 44 C.F.R. part 60,” and that redevelopment shall “require that any construction activities seaward of the coastal construction control lines established pursuant to s. 161.053 be consistent with chapter 161.”	Policy CM6.12 is a new policy that was added to address the requirement.

Could make this clearer, but at a minimum suggest adding “other” in the second sentence as shown below.  Broward County has established a Climate Change Task Force that works toward developing recommendations for a coordinated county-wide strategy to mitigate the local impacts of climate change, including sea level rise. Several <u>other</u> efforts of the Climate Change Task Force include:....”	Not needed.
