| 11 | WHEREAS, Section 18.43 of the Broward County Administrative Code |
| 12 | ("Administrative Code") sets out the policy of the Board of County Commissioners |
| 13 | ("Board") for naming property owned by Broward County ("County"); |
| 14 | WHEREAS, Michael Moskowitz served the County for decades as a lawyer, |
| 15 | philanthropist, and community leader; |
| 16 | WHEREAS, the Broward County Judicial Complex, located at 201 S.E. Sixth |
| 17 | Street, Fort Lauderdale, Florida 33301, is County-owned property; |
| 18 | WHEREAS, on October 11, 2022, the Board provided notice on the record as |
| 19 | required by Section 18.43(h) of the Administrative Code that on November 15, 2022, the |
| 20 | Board would consider the proposed naming of Courtroom 15150 of the Broward County |
| 21 | Judicial Complex ("Courtroom") in honor of Michael Moskowitz, and directed the County |

Administrator to solicit the input of at least three local municipalities, homeowners'

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associations, or other appropriate community groups regarding the Board's proposed naming of the Courtroom; and

WHEREAS, in recognition of the decades of contributions by Michael Moskowitz to the County and the Broward County community, the Board desires to designate the Courtroom as "The Michael Moskowitz Courtroom" in honor of Michael Moskowitz, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Section 1. The Board hereby names the Courtroom as "The Michael Moskowitz Courtroom."

Section 2. The Board further directs the County Administrator to take all budgetary and other actions necessary to effectuate the naming of the Courtroom as set forth herein.

Section 3. Severability.

If any portion of this Resolution is determined by any court to be invalid, the invalid portion will be stricken, and such striking will not affect the validity of the remainder of this Resolution. If any court determines that this Resolution, in whole or in part, cannot be legally applied to any individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such determination will not affect the applicability of this Resolution to any other individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance.
