2	A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA,
3	SUPPORTING THE BROWARD METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION'S MOBILITY PROJECT TO ENHANCE
4	BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN SAFETY ALONG NW 21 ST AVENUE FROM COMMERCIAL BOULEVARD TO NW 26 TH
5	STREET; RECOGNIZING THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AS THE AGENCY RESPONSIBLE FOR
6	THE DESIGN, CONSTRUCTION, AND CONSTRUCTION ADMINISTRATION OF THE PROJECT; AND PROVIDING FOR
7	SEVERABILITY AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.
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9	WHEREAS, the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization ("MPO") has funds
10	under its Transportation Improvement Program to design and construct bicycle lanes and
11	sidewalks along NW 21 st Avenue from Commercial Boulevard to NW 26 th Street, within
12	the cities of Oakland Park, Tamarac, and Fort Lauderdale (collectively, the "Cities"), under
13	Florida Department of Transportation ("FDOT") Financial Project ID 448106-1 ("Project");
14	WHEREAS, the Project is programmed in the MPO's currently adopted
15	FY23-FY27 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) using federal funds;
16	WHEREAS, NW 21 st Avenue from Commercial Boulevard to NW 26 th Street is
17	functionally classified as a Broward County ("County") road, which requires County to
18	maintain or coordinate the maintenance of the road right-of-way;
19	WHEREAS, the MPO collaborated with County, Cities, and FDOT to develop the
20	Project;
21	WHEREAS, the MPO and FDOT require a resolution from County supporting the
22	Project in order for the Project to move forward towards implementation;
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WHEREAS, FDOT will be the agency responsible for the design, construction, and
 construction administration of the Project;

WHEREAS, FDOT's design, construction, and construction administration for the
Project must meet or exceed the "Minimum Standards Applicable to Public Rights-of-Way
Under Broward County Jurisdiction," Section 25.1, Exhibit 25.A, of the Broward County
Administrative Code; and

7 WHEREAS, the Project will further County's complete streets efforts while
8 furthering County's goal to "support the development, design, and construction of
9 sustainable, multi-modal transportation facilities throughout the County, to meet the
10 demands of residents, travelers, and businesses," NOW, THEREFORE,

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12 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF 13 BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:

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15 Section 1. The foregoing "Whereas" clauses are hereby ratified and confirmed16 as being true and correct and are made part of this Resolution.

Section 2. The Board of County Commissioners of Broward County, Florida
("Board"), supports the Project, which will improve conditions for bicyclists and
pedestrians along NW 21st Avenue from Commercial Boulevard to NW 26th Street within
the Project.

Section 3. The Board supports FDOT as the agency responsible for the
Project's design, construction, and construction administration.

23 Section 4. County will continue to maintain or coordinate the maintenance of24 the road right-of-way after the Project's completion.

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1	Section 5. <u>Severability</u> .
2	If any portion of this Resolution is determined by any Court to be invalid, the invalid
3	portion will be stricken, and such striking will not affect the validity of the remainder of this
4	Resolution. If any Court determines that this Resolution, in whole or in part, cannot be
5	legally applied to any individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such
6	determination will not affect the applicability of this Resolution to any other individual,
7	group, entity, property or circumstance.
8	Section 6. <u>Effective Date</u> .
