Coding:

- election to fill the Office within a reasonable time, preferably to coincide with a regularly scheduled election.
- B. Commissioners <u>and the Mayor</u> shall be elected on a partisan basis. The terms of office <u>for both Commissioners and the Mayor</u> shall begin on the Tuesday two (2) weeks following the day of the general or special election.
- C. Except as provided in this Section, election of Commissioners <u>and the Mayor</u> shall be as provided in Article VIII, Section 1(e), of the Florida Constitution.
- D. The Commissioners' salaries shall be determined and established in accordance with the general law of the State of Florida pertaining to compensation for Commissioners of non-charter counties. The Mayor's salary shall be \$250,000 \$220,000 for the 2023 fiscal year (prorated for the first year), and for every fiscal year thereafter shall increase or decrease on October 1 in accordance with the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U), All Items, Miami-Fort Lauderdale-West Palm Beach, FL, calculated by the United States Department of Labor, or successor reports, for the preceding calendar year as most recently reported by the United States Department of Labor. Commissioners and the Mayor shall only be reimbursed for expenses that are specifically approved by the County Commission, and when properly incurred on County business, in conformance with the laws of the State of Florida.
- E. Vacancies on the County Commission shall be defined and filled as provided by the laws of the State of Florida. Other than as a result of redistricting, any Commissioners who cease to reside in the District they represent shall be deemed to have vacated their office. If the Mayor ceases to reside in Broward County, the Mayor will be deemed to have vacated the Office.

F. The Mayor shall not have any employment or independent contractor relationship with any entity for which the Mayor provides personal or professional services, nor shall the Mayor serve as an officer of any business entity. The Mayor may, however, manage his or her personal investments, including real estate and securities, to the extent not otherwise prohibited by law, and may participate in the activities of nonprofit charitable, religious, professional, or social organizations, including by serving on such organization's board of directors, provided the Mayor does not receive compensation or other remuneration from the entity.

Section 2. Subject to an affirmative vote of the general electorate, Section 2.02 of Article II of the Charter of Broward County, Florida, entitled Term Limitation for County Commissioner Office, is hereby amended, effective November 8, 2022, to read as follows:

Sec. 2.02. Term limitation for County Commissioner office.

Effective with the terms of the Commissioners that commenced in November 2000, aAn individual shall not be eligible for election as a Commissioner, including Mayor, for more than three consecutive four-year terms. An individual shall not be eligible for election as Mayor for more than two consecutive four-year terms. Service as a Commissioner prior to the terms that commenced in November 2000 shall not be considered in applying the term limitations of this Section. Service of a two-year term, or any other partial term subsequent to November 2000, shall not be considered in applying the term limitation provisions of this Section. For purposes of this section, the offices of Mayor and County Commissioner shall be considered separate offices, and service as the Mayor or County Commissioner shall not be considered when applying the term limitation provisions in this section to the other office.

Section 12. Financial Impact of the Charter Amendment.

If any court determines that this Resolution, in whole or in part, cannot be legally applied to any individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such determination will not affect the applicability of this Resolution to any other individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance.
