7	WHEREAS, Broward County seeks to provide members of the public with a
8	reasonable opportunity to be heard while balancing this opportunity against the need for
9	efficient County Commission meetings, NOW, THEREFORE,
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11	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF
12	BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:
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14	Section 1. Section 18.6 of the Broward County Administrative Code is hereby
15	amended to read as follows:
16	18.6. Public Participation.
17	a. Opportunity for Public Comment. Members of the public shall be provided
18	a reasonable opportunity to be heard on agenda items before the County Commission,
19	unless otherwise stated in this section or provided by law.
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21	3. <i>Time Limits</i> . The following time limits shall apply to members of the public
22	addressing the County Commission:
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	Coding: Words in struck-through type are deletions from existing text. Words in underscored type are additions.

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(a)	If five (5) or fewer individuals are registered to speak on an agenda
	item, then each registered individual shall have three (3) minutes to
	speak.

(b) If more than five (5) individuals are registered to speak on an agenda item, the Mayor may limit each registered individual to two (2) minutes of speaking time.

(g) If two or more related agenda items are heard together, all such items shall be treated as one item for purposes of determining time limits, but the provisions of subsection 3(b) above shall not apply to any speaker who registered to speak on two or more of the agenda items being heard together.

Coding:

Section 2. <u>Severability</u>.

If any portion of this Administrative Code Resolution is determined by any court to be invalid, the invalid portion will be stricken, and such striking will not affect the validity of the remainder of this Resolution. If any court determines that this Resolution, in whole or in part, cannot be legally applied to any individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such determination will not affect the applicability of this Resolution to any other individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance.

Section 3. <u>Inclusion in the Broward County Administrative Code</u>.

It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners that the provisions of this Administrative Code Resolution become part of the Broward County Administrative Code as of the effective date. The sections of this Administrative Code Resolution may be

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1	renumbered or relettered and the word "resolution" may be changed to "section," "article,"
2	or such other appropriate word or phrase to the extent necessary in order to accomplish
3	such intention.
