11	WHEREAS, Section 327.4108, Florida Statutes, grants counties the ability to
12	establish anchoring limitation areas adjacent to urban areas that have residential docking
13	facilities and significant recreational boating traffic; and
14	WHEREAS, the City of Hollywood (the "City") has requested that Broward County
15	(the "County") designate a portion of its navigable-in-fact waterways as anchoring
16	limitation areas,
17	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF
18	BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:
19	Section 1. Article XII of Chapter 21 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances
20	is hereby created to read as follows:

ARTICLE XII. ANCHORING LIMITATION AREAS

23 Sec. 21-171. In general.

For the purposes of this article, the following terms apply:

Anchoring Limitation Area means an area in which a person may not anchor a
vessel for more than forty-five (45) consecutive days in any six (6) month period, subject,
however, to the exemptions in Sections 327.4108(4)-(5), Florida Statutes.

Vessel is synonymous with boat as referenced in Article VII, Section 1(b), of the
Florida Constitution and includes every description of watercraft, barge, and airboat, other
than a seaplane on the water, used or capable of being used as a means of transportation
on water.

32 Sec. 21-172. Enforcement.

Enforcement of this article is as provided for in Sections 327.41086(6)-(7) and
327.73(1)(z), Florida Statutes.

35 Sec. 21-173. Designated Anchoring Limitation Areas.

The following areas within Broward County, Florida, are hereby designated as
Anchoring Limitation Areas:

(a) North Lake within Hollywood, Florida, specifically: Being all of Block 71,
"Hollywood Lakes Section," according to the plat thereof, as recorded in Plat Book 1,
page 32, of the public records of Broward County, Florida; less and except therefrom
Parcel #4 as shown on the plat of "Florida East Coast Canal," as recorded in Plat Book 17,
page 23A, of the public records of Broward County, Florida; less and except all of that
lake area described above being within 150 feet of any public or private marine boat ramp,

44 boatyard, or other public vessel launching or loading facility; said lands situated, lying,
45 and being in the City of Hollywood, Broward County, Florida.

46 (b) South Lake within Hollywood, Florida, specifically: Being all of Block 76, 47 "Hollywood Lakes Section," according to the plat thereof, as recorded in Plat Book 1, 48 page 32, of the public records of Broward County Florida; less and except therefrom 49 Parcel #6, as shown on the plat of "Florida East Coast Canal," as recorded in Plat 50 Book 17, page 23A, of the public records of Broward County, Florida; less and except 51 therefrom all of that lake area described above being within 150 feet of any public or 52 private marine, boat ramp, boatyard, or other public vessel launching or loading facility; 53 said lands situated, lying, and being in the City of Hollywood, Broward County, Florida.

Section 2. Severability.

If any portion of this Ordinance is determined by any court to be invalid, the invalid portion will be stricken, and such striking will not affect the validity of the remainder of this Ordinance. If any court determines that this Ordinance, in whole or in part, cannot be legally applied to any individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such determination will not affect the applicability of this Ordinance to any other individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance.

Section 3. Inclusion in the Broward County Code of Ordinances.
