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9	WHEREAS, in conjunction with skin color, society has historically considered hair
10	texture, hair type, and hairstyle to classify individuals on the basis of race;
11	WHEREAS, hair has been, and remains, a source of racial discrimination that has
12	caused serious economic ramifications to individuals, including in Broward County; and
13	WHEREAS, the Broward County Board of County Commissioners finds it
14	appropriate to include hair as a characteristic of race as part of the prohibition of
15	discrimination under the Human Rights Act,
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17	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF
18	BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:
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20	Section 1. Section 16 ¹ / ₂ -3 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby
21	amended to read as follows, with all remaining definitions being relettered accordingly:
22	Sec. 16 ¹ / ₂ -3. Definitions.
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	Coding: Words in struck-through type are deletions from existing text. Words in
	underscored type are additions.

1 *Race* includes traits historically associated with race, including, but not (ss) 2 limited to, hair texture, hair type, and protective hairstyles such as braids, locs, and twists. 3 (ss) (tt) *Real estate broker, salesperson, or or agent* includes any person authorized 4 to perform an action on behalf of another person regarding any matter related to the sale 5 or rental of dwellings, including offers, solicitations, or contracts, and the administration 6 of matters regarding such offers, solicitations, or contracts, or any real estate-related 7 transactions.

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Section 2. <u>Severability</u>.

If any portion of this Ordinance is determined by any court to be invalid, the invalid portion will be stricken, and such striking will not affect the validity of the remainder of this Ordinance. If any court determines that this Ordinance, in whole or in part, cannot be legally applied to any individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such determination will not affect the applicability of this Ordinance to any other individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance.

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Section 3. Inclusion in the Broward County Code of Ordinances.

19 It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners that the provisions of this
20 Ordinance become part of the Broward County Code of Ordinances as of the effective
21 date. The sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered and the word
22 "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or such other appropriate word or
23 phrase to the extent necessary in order to accomplish such intention.
