ORDINANCE NO. 2021-

ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY. FLORIDA. PERTAINING TO EXEMPTIONS FROM ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCE LICENSING: AMENDING SECTION 27-335 OF BROWARD COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES ("CODE"); **AMENDING EXEMPTIONS RESOURCE** ÈNVIRONMENTAL **LICENSING** CERTAIN PROJECTS PERFORMED BY THE UNITED STATES ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS AND BROWARD COUNTY'S PORT EVERGLADES DEPARTMENT: PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

(Sponsored by the Board of County Commissioners)

WHEREAS, Chapter 27 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances ("Code") requires persons performing dredging, filling, or alteration within regulated aquatic or wetland resources alteration to obtain an Environmental Resource License from the Broward County Environmental Protection and Growth Management Department ("EPGMD");

WHEREAS, the United States Army Corps of Engineers ("Army Corps") maintains that it is exempt from local authorization requirements and that proper mitigation for impacts from dredging, filling, and aquatic resource alteration projects will be assured through local government involvement and compliance with state and federal permitting requirements;

WHEREAS, Section 27-335 of the Code currently provides narrow exemptions from Environmental Resource Licensing for dredging by the Army Corps and maintenance dredging by Broward County's Port Everglades Department, but it does not exempt filling or alteration within regulated aquatic and wetland resources;

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WHEREAS, broadening the exemptions to include filling and alteration will aid in the implementation of the Port Everglades Department's adopted Master/Vision Plan; and WHEREAS, such filling and alteration projects will be adequately protective of the environment if all actions undertaken as part of the project are properly permitted by necessary state and federal agencies, and EPGMD is provided the required advance notice,

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BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Section 1. Section 27-335 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

## Sec. 27-335. Exemptions.

The following projects are exempt from license requirements:

. . .

(7) Projects by the United States Army Corps of Engineers dredging projects for which within Broward County is a local sponsor, provided that the Port Everglades Department submits notice to the County Administrator of its intent to proceed under this exemption, and the County Administrator, through the County's participation in the planning and design of the project, is able to ensure that potential impacts of the project are properly addressed all other required federal and state authorizations are obtained and complied with, and EPGMD is provided copies of the federal and state authorizations at least thirty (30) days before commencement of the project.

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Maintenance dDredging, filling, or alteration projects conducted by the Port Everglades Department, if the County Administrator determines that the dredging, filling, or alteration to be performed is no more than is necessary to restore previously dredged areas to original design specifications or configurations, previously undisturbed natural areas are not significantly impacted, all other required federal and state authorizations are obtained and complied with, best management practices are followed, and EPGMD is notified at least thirty (30) days before the commencement of maintenance dredging provided copies of the federal and state authorizations at least thirty (30) days before commencement of the project.

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## Section 2. Severability.

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If any portion of this Ordinance is determined by any court to be invalid, the invalid portion will be stricken, and such striking will not affect the validity of the remainder of this Ordinance. If any court determines that this Ordinance, in whole or in part, cannot be legally applied to any individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such determination will not affect the applicability of this Ordinance to any other individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance.

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## Section 3. <u>Inclusion in the Broward County Code of Ordinances.</u>

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It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners that the provisions of this Ordinance become part of the Broward County Code of Ordinances as of the effective date. The sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered and the word
