## **RESOLUTION NO. 2021-**

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, URGING THE UNITED STATES FEDERAL GOVERNMENT TO PROVIDE THE REPUBLIC OF HAITI WITH TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE, TRAINING, FINANCIAL SUPPORT, AND SECURITY SUPPORT FOR THE COUNTRY'S UPCOMING ELECTIONS; DIRECTING THE COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR TO PROVIDE A COPY OF THIS RESOLUTION TO THE OFFICIALS DESIGNATED HEREIN; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, in 1804, Jean Jacques Dessalines and Alexander Petion, leaders of two rival groups, met and joined forces to defeat French colonial rule, thereby leading to the independence of Haiti and the creation of the first Black Republic in the world;

WHEREAS, the fight for Haitian independence ultimately created the circumstances that led France to sell the Louisiana territory, which included all of Arkansas, Missouri, Iowa, Oklahoma, Kansas, and Nebraska, and portions of Louisiana, North Dakota, South Dakota, Montana, Wyoming, Colorado, and Minnesota, to the United States in 1803;

WHEREAS, the Republic of Haiti ("Haiti") was the first nation to permanently ban both slavery and the slave trade;

WHEREAS, Haiti and descendants of persons of Haitian origin have been instrumental to the history of the United States, including through their bravery in fighting for United States independence at the 1779 Battle of Savannah and the founding of the City of Chicago by Jean Baptiste Point du Sable, traditionally recognized as being of Haitian descent;

1 WHEREAS, the Haitian government provided refuge to Simon Bolivar and offered 2 military and other technical assistance to Bolivar as he sought to win independence from 3 colonial rule for various countries in Central and South America; 4 WHEREAS, South Florida has a Haitian-American population of more than 5 300,000, and Broward County is home to more than 116,000 people of Haitian ancestry; 6 WHEREAS, the United States and Haiti had \$2.3 billion in total goods trade during 7 2019, and Haiti conducted approximately \$1 billion in trade with South Florida during 8 2020: 9 WHEREAS, parliamentary elections are scheduled to be held in Haiti on 10 September 19, 2021; 11 WHEREAS, the promotion of free and fair elections and political stability in Haiti is 12 in the best interests of the United States; and 13 WHEREAS, the United States has the ability to support a safe and credible election 14 process in Haiti by providing technical assistance, training, financial support, and security 15 support in connection with the parliamentary elections, NOW, THEREFORE, 16 17 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF 18 BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA: 19 20 Section 1. The Broward County Board of County Commissioners urges the 21 United States federal government to provide Haiti with technical assistance, training, 22 financial support, and security support for the country's upcoming parliamentary elections. 23 24

The County Administrator shall transmit a certified copy of this 1 Section 2. 2 resolution to the President of the United States, the Members of the Florida Congressional 3 Delegation, and the Members of the Broward County State Legislative Delegation. 4 Section 3. Severability. 5 If any portion of this Resolution is determined by any court to be invalid, the invalid 6 portion will be stricken, and such striking will not affect the validity of the remainder of this 7 Resolution. If any court determines that this Resolution, in whole or in part, cannot be 8 legally applied to any individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such determination will not affect the applicability of this Resolution to any other individual, 9 10 group, entity, property, or circumstance.
