Following the initial evaluation, the NIS will provide the property owner/manager with specific recommendations for reducing total irrigation demands and increasing irrigation system efficiency through appropriate modifications in the landscape design, and irrigation system maintenance and operation. The results of the evaluation will be summarized in a site report to be distributed to the property owner/manager, presented in quarterly and annual program reports, and will include a description of the irrigation system and site; list of recommended improvements; summary of current water consumption, potential water savings, and water savings realized as a result of the initial evaluation.			
16. Deliverables, milestones or scope of this action:	F. No more than three months following the initial evaluation, conduct a follow-up evaluation of the three sites selected by the City of Coconut Creek. The follow-up evaluation will consist of an assessment of the degree to which the site- specific recommendations have been implemented and quantification of the water savings achieved as a result of the recommended improvements.			
	 G. Identify and coordinate property managers/owners interested in pursuing NatureScape Certification as part of the NIS evaluation. The County will provide property managers with expert assistance in developing a Florida Friendly landscape in order to meet the NatureScape Broward certification criteria. Properties certified as NatureScape properties as a result of the NIS evaluation will be with identified in the annual program reports. H. Conduct additional NIS site evaluations within each service area in accordance with Exhibit A.
