1 **RESOLUTION NO. 2021-**2 OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY RESOLUTION COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA. 3 PERTAINING TO HOLIDAYS; CREATING SECTION 14.227 OF THE BROWARD COUNTY ADMINISTRATIVE CODE 4 "ADMINISTRATIVE CODE"); DESIGNATING "JUNETEENTH") AS ΑN **OFFICIAL HOLIDAY** 5 **EMPLOYEES**; **PROVIDING** COUNTY AND SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE ADMINISTRATIVE 6 CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE. 7 8 (Sponsored by Commissioner Dale V.C. Holness) 9 10 WHEREAS, on September 22, 1862, President Abraham Lincoln signed the Emancipation Proclamation, announcing that, effective January 1, 1863, all persons held 11 12 as slaves within any state then being in rebellion against the United States shall be 13 "forever free." Over two years later, on June 19, 1865, the Union Army informed enslaved 14 African Americans in Galveston, Texas, of their freedom from slavery and the end of the 15 Civil War: 16 WHEREAS, June 19, also known as Juneteenth, commemorates this event and 17 celebrates the end of slavery in the United States, and therefore is an opportunity for all 18 Americans to celebrate freedom and equal rights; 19 WHEREAS, Juneteenth is recognized as a holiday in more than 45 states, 20 including Florida and the District of Columbia; 21 WHEREAS, several states, including New York, Virginia, New Jersey, and 22 Massachusetts, and municipalities, including New York City and Portland, have 23 recognized Juneteenth as a paid day of leave for their employees. Additionally, 24 Miami-Dade County and several local municipalities, such as the City of Tamarac and the

2 and 3 WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners (the "Board") wishes to amend the Broward County Administrative Code to add Juneteenth (June 19) as a paid holiday 4 5 observed by Broward County government starting in 2021, NOW, THEREFORE, 6 7 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF 8 BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA: 9 10 Section 1. Section 14.227 of the Broward County Administrative Code is hereby amended to read as follows: 11 12 14.227. Holidays. 13 The following are designated as official holidays for full-time and part-time a. 20+ County employees: 14 15 1. New Year's Day. 16 2. Martin Luther King Day. 17 3. President's Day. 18 4. Memorial Day. 19 5. Juneteenth (June 19). 20 <del>5.</del> 6. Independence Day. 21 <del>6.</del> 7. Labor Day. 22 <del>7.</del> 8. Veteran's Veterans Day. 23 <del>8</del>. <u>9.</u> Thanksgiving Day and the day after. 24 <del>9.</del> <u>10.</u> Christmas Day. Two (2) days of the employee's choice in the form of annual leave. A full-time employee assigned to a five (5) day workweek shall receive sixteen (16) hours. Full-time employees assigned to a four (4) day workweek shall receive twenty (20) hours. Part-time 20+ employees shall receive eight (8) hours of annual leave regardless of their work schedule.

It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners that the provisions of this Administrative Code Resolution become part of the Broward County Administrative Code as of the effective date. The sections of this Administrative Code Resolution may be renumbered or relettered and the word "resolution" may be changed to "section," "article," or such other appropriate word or phrase to the extent necessary in order to accomplish such intention.
