Dear Honorable Mayor Geller, Vice Mayor Udine, Commissioners and Ms. Henry:

The South Florida Business Council has been a strong supporter of Visit Florida, our state's tourism marketing agency. We encourage the Broward County Commission to make Visit Florida a legislative priority for 2021. Last year, Discover the Palm Beaches partnered with Visit Florida to develop a destination-specific strategy. By so doing, our friends to the north capitalized on a 1:1 match of marketing funding, doubling their impact.

We are happy to report that the Palm Beach County Commission has identified Visit Florida as a legislative priority this year. We would like you to do the same.
