3	COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, PERTAINING TO MOTOR VEHICLE PASSENGER
4	DISPATCH SERVICES; AMENDING VARIOUS SECTIONS OF CHAPTER 22½ OF THE BROWARD COUNTY CODE OF
5	ORDINANCES ("CODE"); PROVIDING FOR MANDATORY 24-HOUR-A-DAY DISPATCH SERVICES; PROVIDING FOR
6	CERTAIN RESTRICTIONS ON ANNUAL OPERATING PERMITS IF FINES OR FEES ARE OWED BY
7	APPLICANTS; PROVIDING FOR RESTRICTIONS ON ENTITIES THAT HAVE PREVIOUSLY SUBMITTED FALSE
8	OR INTENTIONALLY MISLEADING INFORMATION; PROVIDING FOR ENFORCEMENT AND PENALTIES;
9	AMENDING SECTION 8½-16 OF THE CODE; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE
10	CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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13	WHEREAS, the Broward County Environmental and Consumer Protection
14	Division ("ECPD") seeks to address a number of issues regarding vehicles for hire,
15	including availability of dispatch services, difficulties with fee and fine collection, and
16	appropriate consequences for providing false information;
17	WHEREAS, ECPD believes that certain modifications are appropriate to improve
18	motor vehicle dispatch services; and
19	WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Broward County has
20	determined that the proposed modifications are in the best interest of the safety and
21	welfare of the citizens of Broward County,
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23	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF
24	BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:
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1	Section 1. Chapter 22½-1 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby
2	amended to read as follows:
3	Sec. 22½-1. Definitions.
4	This Chapter may be referred to and cited as the "Motor Carriers Ordinance." For
5	the purposes of this Chapter, the following definitions shall apply unless the context of
6	their usage clearly indicates another meaning:
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8	(u) Qualified individual with disability means an individual who has: 1) a
9	physical or mental impairment that substantiality limits one (1) or more of the major life
10	activities of such individual; 2) a record of such impairment; or 3) been regarded as having
11	such an impairment.
12	(v) Dispatch service means an individual or entity that dispatches taxicab
13	and/or luxury sedan operators to provide transportation for potential customers.
14	The fact that words in this Chapter are phrased in the singular or plural, in any
15	certain gender, or in any tense shall not prohibit the application of its provisions as
16	common sense and the context require.
17	Section 2. Section 221/2-6A of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is
18	hereby amended to read as follows:
19	Sec. 22½-6A. Permits—General.
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21	(d) The County may deny an application or not renew a permit if it determines
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1	(3)	The applicant or permittee has outstanding fees or fines under this Chapter			
2		owed to the Division or the Broward County Aviation Department;			
3	(4)	The applicant or permittee has a history of poor performance pertaining to			
4		vehicles "for-hire" that substantially relates to the permit; and/or			
5	(5)	The applicant or permittee has a history of violating any of the criteria listed			
6		above in subsection (c)-;			
7	<u>(6)</u>	One or more current owners, officers, directors, partners, or members of the			
8		applicant or permittee owe fees or fines to the Division or the			
9		Broward County Aviation Department; and/or			
10	<u>(7)</u>	One or more current owners, officers, directors, partners, or members of the			
11		applicant or permittee are or were owners, officers, directors, partners, or			
12		members of another entity that owes fees or fines to the Division or the			
13		Broward County Aviation Department arising from a time period when the			
14		owner, officer, director, partner, or member was associated with the entity			
15		that owes fees or fines.

17	(r)	Each permit holder shall maintain or designate a place of business in			
18	Broward Cou	ınty, at which place shall be a properly listed telephone for receiving all calls			
19	for transporta	ation service, and at which place or business, location the business records			
20	and required daily manifests are kept and are available for inspection or audit by				
21	Broward Cou	Broward County. It shall also be the responsibility of every permit or license holder to			
22	keep on file	keep on file with the Division its business and other telephone numbers where it may			
23	normally be i	reached from time to time.			
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1	Section	on 3. Section 22½-8 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby		
2	amended to read as follows:

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5	(e)	Each chauffeur's registration applicant must:		
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7	(8)	Not have, within the last five (5) years, accumulated twenty-four (24) or		
8		more points on his or her driving record-; and		
9	<u>(9)</u>	Have fully paid any and all fines or fees owed to the Division or the		
10		Broward County Aviation Department.		
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12	Section	on 4. Section 221/2-9E of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is		
13	hereby creat	ed to read as follows:

15	Sec. 22½-9E	. Operations—Dispatch.		
16	(a)	Each certificate holder must notify the Division of the dispatch service the		
17	certificate ho	older utilizes. If currently operating as of [INSERT EFFECTIVE DATE OF		
18	ENACTMEN	T], the certificate holder must notify the Division of the dispatch service it		
19	utilizes within	n sixty (60) days after [INSERT EFFECTIVE DATE OF ENACTMENT]. A		
20	certificate ho	lder may not utilize more than one dispatch service. A certificate holder may		
21	not utilize a c	lispatch service that is not registered with the Division. The dispatch service		
22	utilized mus	t be identified on the permit application and renewal application by a		
23	certificate ho	lder.		
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- Each dispatch service must register with the Division. If currently operating (b) as of [INSERT EFFECTIVE DATE OF ENACTMENT], the dispatch service must register within sixty (60) days after [INSERT EFFECTIVE DATE OF ENACTMENT]. application fee is due for registering as a dispatch service. To register, each dispatch service must provide the Division with the following documents:
 - (1) A fully completed application on a form prescribed by the Division;
 - (2) Documentation indicating the type of business entity registering as a dispatch service (e.g., corporation, partnership, etc.);
 - (3) Any additional information that may be required by the Division relating to the dispatch service's business activities, including information deemed necessary by the Division to enforce the provisions of this section.
- (c) If the Consumer Protection Board issues an order determining that a dispatch service applicant, or a current owner, officer, director, partner, or member of the applicant, submitted false or misleading information to the Division, that applicant, and the applicable owner, officer, director, partner, or member, if any, shall be removed from the roll of registered dispatch services and shall be prohibited from registering as a dispatch service for a two (2) year period commencing on the date of the order.
- (d) Each dispatch service must provide dispatch services twenty-four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week to all certificate holders utilizing that dispatch service.
- (e) Dispatch services cannot be provided by an individual while operating a vehicle for hire.
- Section 5. Section 22½-13 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec.	221/2-13.	Suspension;	revocation:	forfeiture:	penalties.
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(a) Except as otherwise specified, certificates, permits, registrations, and jitney licenses issued pursuant to this Chapter shall be subject to suspension, revocation, or forfeiture as follows:

- (5) <u>Dispatch service registrations</u>: Upon notice and hearing, when it shall appear that:
 - a. The dispatch service registration was obtained by an application in which any material fact was falsely stated or intentionally omitted;
 - <u>b.</u> The dispatch service has failed to comply with any of the provisions
 <u>of this Chapter; or</u>
 - <u>The dispatch service failed to render the service authorized by the registration.</u>
- (b) Certificates, permits, registrations, or jitney licenses may be suspended, revoked, or forfeited prior to hearing when it appears based on determination of the Director that:

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(c) All hearings required by this section shall be preceded by a minimum of ten (10) days' prior written notice forwarded to the last known address maintained by the Division. The notice shall specify the proposed action and the grounds upon which the action is predicated. The certificate, permit, or registration holder (as the case may be) may be represented by legal counsel and shall be entitled to present a defense to the proposed action. All such hearings shall be conducted in accordance with the rules of the Consumer Protection Board for conducting hearings. The Division shall promptly

notify all parties of the final decision. There shall be a service fee to reinstate a suspended 2 certificate or permit, which fee shall be set by resolution of the Commission. 3 4 Section 6. If any court determines that this Ordinance, in whole or in part, cannot be 21 legally applied to any individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such 22 determination will not affect the applicability of this Ordinance to any other individual, 23 group, entity, property, or circumstance. 24

5	"ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or such other appropriate word or
6	phrase to the extent necessary in order to accomplish such intention.
7	Section 9. <u>Effective Date</u> .
