CONTRACT ADMINISTRATOR UPON SUCH NOTICE, AS CONTRACT ADMINISTRATOR DEEMS APPROPRIATE UNDER THE CIRCUMSTANCES IN THE EVENT CONTRACT ADMINISTRATOR DETERMINES THAT TERMINATION IS NECESSARY TO PROTECT THE PUBLIC HEALTH OR SAFETY. CONTINUATION OF AGREEMENT IS SUBJECT TO AVAILABILITY OF APPROPRIATIONS. AN ERRONEOUS TERMINATION FOR CAUSE SHALL BE CONSIDERED A TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE. EITHER PARTY MAY WITHDRAW FROM THE RIR PROGRAM WITHOUT TERMINATING THE REMAINDER OF THIS AGREEMENT BY PROVIDING NOTICE OF ITS INTENT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE NOTICES SECTION OF THIS AGREEMENT.

The COUNTY shall perform all work identified in this Agreement, including:

- A. Provide overall administration of the Agreement.
- B. Coordinate at least one meeting annually with NIS partners.
- C. Provide reports to NIS partner as requested on inspection results, rebate expenditures, and water savings, and provide an annual report no more than 30 days after the April 12th end of each Program year.
- D. Perform NIS evaluations on properties located within the water service area supported by the City of Miramar.
- E. On an annual basis, conduct an initial evaluation on at least three sites that are to be selected at the discretion of the City of Miramar. Following the initial evaluation, the NIS will provide the property owner/manager with specific recommendations for reducing total irrigation demands and increasing irrigation system efficiency through appropriate modifications in the landscape design, and irrigation system maintenance and operation. The results of the evaluation will be summarized in a site report to be distributed to the property owner/manager, presented in quarterly and annual program reports, and will include a description of the irrigation system and site; list of recommended improvements; summary of current water consumption, potential water savings, and water savings realized as a result of the initial evaluation.
- F. No more than three months following the initial evaluation, conduct a follow-up evaluation of the three sites selected by the City of Miramar. The follow-up evaluation will consist of an assessment of the degree to which the site-specific recommendations have been implemented and quantification of the water savings achieved as a result of the recommended improvements.
- G. Identify and coordinate property managers/owners interested in pursuing NatureScape Certification as part of the NIS evaluation. The County will provide property managers with expert assistance in developing a Florida Friendly landscape in order to meet the NatureScape Broward certification criteria. Properties certified as NatureScape properties as a result of the NIS evaluation will be with identified in the annual program reports.
- H. Conduct additional NIS site evaluations within each service area in accordance with Exhibit A.
- Prepare a five-year summary of NIS program accomplishments, including: 1) total number and location of properties evaluated; 2) analysis of potential versus actual water savings achieved as a result of the program; 3) discussion of realized improvements in landscape practices with consideration of water quality implications; 4) identification of NatureScape properties certified as a result of the NIS, and; 5) assessment of the overall performance of the NIS.

<u>Items J through P apply only if and when NIS partner has opted to participate in the Residential Irrigation Rebate (RIR) Program.</u>

J. Issue rebates through the RIR Program, as funded by NIS Partner, to residents who purchase and install specified water-saving measures.

  L. Periodically assess available water-saving measures to be used for rebates to ensure the RIR Program stays current with technology and standards.
