6	CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

9	WHEREAS, on January 9, 2020, the Seventeenth Judicial Circuit determined		
10	several provisions of the Broward County Code of Ordinances ("Code") violated the state		
11	preemption on firearms and ammunition set forth under Section 790.33, Florida Statutes;		
12	WHEREAS, the Fourth District Court of Appeal affirmed the decision of the trial		
13	court, declaring various provisions of the Code invalid;		
14	WHEREAS, the Code provisions found to be preempted have never been enforced		
15	or threatened to be enforced with respect to firearms, ammunition, and components		
16	thereof, and the County has never intended to regulate firearms, ammunition, and		
17	components thereof through these provisions; and		
18	WHEREAS, this amendment further clarifies that the County does not in any way		
19	regulate firearms, ammunition, or components thereof in violation of state law,

1	Section 1. Section 2-2 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby		
2	amended to read as follows:		
3	Sec. 2-2. Definitions.		
4	For the purpose of this Chapter 2, the following terms, phrases, words, and their		
5	derivations shall have the meanings given herein when not inconsistent with the text,		
6	unless otherwise specifically defined, or the context of their usage clearly indicates		
7	another meaning. The word "shall" is mandatory, and the word "may" is permissive.		
8	Words relating to aeronautical practices, processes, and equipment shall be construed		
9	according to their usage in the aviation industry.

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Any person to whom an approved Airport Issued <del>(h)</del> (g) Suspensions. Identification Media has been issued by the Aviation Department and to whom a notice of violation is issued for a violation of Section 2-39 shall be required to surrender his or her Airport Issued Identification Media pursuant to the written policy established by the Aviation Director and incorporated into the Airport Security Program. A person who has been issued a notice of violation shall have the right to a hearing in accordance with procedures established by the Aviation Director and incorporated into the Airport Security Program.

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Section 3. Section 2-137.1 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2-137.1. Airport security at North Perry Airport.

- <del>(e)</del> Weapons.
- <del>(1)</del> Unless duly authorized by state or federal law, no person, other than federal, state, or local law enforcement officers on duty, shall carry or transport any weapon on the Airport in a manner contrary to governing law, provided that this prohibition shall not be applicable to the extent preempted by Chapter 790, Florida Statutes (firearms, ammunition, or components thereof).
- <del>(2)</del> No person shall furnish, give, sell, or trade any weapon or simulated weapon on the Airport unless authorized under appropriate lease with or permit issued by the County, provided that this prohibition shall not be

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applicable to the extent preempted by Chapter 790, Florida Statutes (firearms, ammunition, or components thereof).

<del>(f)</del> (e) Enforcement. Law enforcement officers assigned to the Airport by the Broward Sheriff's Office and/or the Pembroke Pines Police Department, or other Department employees designated by the Director of Aviation or the Airport Manager, shall be responsible for enforcement of this Section 2-137.1 and, where applicable, the Federal Aviation Administration and the Transportation Security Administration.

Section 4. Section 22½-9A of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

## Sec. 22½-9A. Operations—Minimum standards of conduct.

The role of certificate, license, and permit holders is essential to enhance and showcase public transportation services to the residents and visitors of Broward County. Intrinsic to operation of a quality public transportation service is the conduct of each certificate, license, and permit holder. Therefore, all such holders are required to comply with the following minimum standards:

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- <del>(u)</del> Possession of switchblades, knives, clubs, or other weapons by an operator, whether in the vehicle or on the person, is prohibited, provided that this prohibition shall not be applicable to the extent preempted by Chapter 790, Florida Statutes (firearms, ammunition, or components thereof).
- Routes to trip destinations shall be the most direct and economical to the <del>(v)</del> (u) passenger unless otherwise directed or agreed to by the passenger.

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- (w) (v) Each motor carrier shall keep accurate records of receipts from operations, operating and other expenses, capital expenditures, and such other operating information as may be required by the Division. The Director shall be allowed access to the records during normal business hours for the purposes of inspection or copy. Such records shall be confidential to the full extent allowed by law.
- (x) (w) No operator shall refuse to dispatch a taxicab to any place in Broward County for service authorized by the terms of the applicable certificate.

## Section 5. Severability.

If any portion of this Ordinance is determined by any court to be invalid, the invalid portion will be stricken, and such striking will not affect the validity of the remainder of this Ordinance. If any court determines that this Ordinance, in whole or in part, cannot be legally applied to any individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such determination will not affect the applicability of this Ordinance to any other individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance.

## Section 6. <u>Inclusion in the Broward County Code of Ordinances</u>.

It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners that the provisions of this Ordinance become part of the Broward County Code of Ordinances as of the effective date. The sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or such other appropriate word or phrase to the extent necessary in order to accomplish such intention.
