I. Planning Council Staff Transmittal Recommendation

June 13, 2023

It is recommended that the proposed amendment to the BrowardNext - Broward County Land Use Plan be approved. **See Attachment 1.**

As the Planning Council is aware, the Broward County Charter requires at least one Planning Council public hearing and Article 1.2(A) of the *Administrative Rules Document: BrowardNext* outlines the following circumstances in which a second Planning Council public hearing may be recommended or required:

- (1) At its initial public hearing, the Planning Council takes an action to recommend denial of a proposed amendment; or
- (2) At its initial public hearing, the Planning Council takes an action to recommend approval subject to meeting specific criteria or policy prior to a second Planning Council public hearing; or
- (3) At its initial public hearing, the Planning Council votes by a majority of the members present with a minimum of six (6) affirmative votes for a second Planning Council public hearing; or
- (4) If the County Commission requests by a vote of the majority of members present to request a second Planning Council public hearing; or
- (5) If an objection or comment on adverse impacts to important state resources or facilities is issued during the State of Florida Chapter 163 review process; or
- (6) If State of Florida Chapter 163 requires or is modified to require a second local planning agency public hearing.

If the Planning Council chooses to require a second Planning Council public hearing per Article 1.2(A)(1)(2) or (3), such recommendation must be made as part of its motion.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

On February 21, 2023, the Broward County Board of County Commissioners initiated a text amendment to the BrowardNext – Broward County Land Use Plan (BCLUP) to update existing Policy 2.21.6 to include a reference to support the goals of the Southeast Florida Regional Climate Action Plan (RCAP). **See Attachment 1.**

Upon the transmittal of the proposed amendment to Planning Council staff, an email request for comments was sent to all local government mayors, managers and planners on April 5, 2023, including a summary of the intent of the proposed amendment. No comments have been received as of this writing.

PLANNING ANALYSIS AND SUMMARY

Existing BCLUP Policy 2.21.6 was added to the BCLUP with the adoption of BrowardNext in April 2017 to support the implementation of the recommended actions of the Climate Change Action Plan (CCAP) which was initially approved in 2015 and updated in 2020.

About the Broward County Climate Change Action Plan: The CCAP consists of nearly 125 strategic actions for addressing the economic, environmental and social impacts of climate change. The CCAP is a county-wide strategy to be implemented by local government, community partners and residents alike. The actions are focused on reducing local greenhouse gas emissions, increasing community resiliency, and planning necessary adaptation measures to address local impacts. By implementing these actions, Broward County moves forward on building a greener, more sustainable, and climate-resilient community.

Specifically, the proposed amendment expands Policy 2.21.6 to include a reference to support the goals of the Southeast Florida Regional Climate Action Plan as updated in November 2022.

About the Southeast Florida Regional Climate Action Plan: The RCAP is a voluntary framework designed to align, guide and support the acceleration of local and regional climate action in Southeast Florida to realize a healthy, prosperous, more equitable and resilient, low-carbon region. The RCAP includes goals and recommendations for each of the following: agriculture, energy, equity, informed and engaged communities, natural systems, public health, public policy advocacy, regional economic resilience, risk reduction and emergency management, sustainable communities and transportation and water.

PLANNING ANALYSIS AND SUMMARY (continued)

Conclusion

Planning Council staff finds that the proposed amendment promotes local and regional commitments to focus on a sustainable and resilient community. Therefore, Planning Council staff recommends approval of the proposed amendment and does not recommend a second Planning Council public hearing. **See Attachment 1.**

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CLIMATE RESILIENCY, ADAPTATION ACTION AREAS AND PRIORITY PLANNING AREAS

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The update to Policy 2.21.6 was initiated by the Broward County Commission to support the inclusion of the Southeast Florida Regional Action Plan. All changes are indicated in ~~strike-through~~/underline format.

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POLICY 2.21.6 Broward County shall support the goals and will, to the maximum extent feasible, implement, in coordination with affected stakeholders, the recommended actions of the Broward County Climate Change Action Plan, and the Southeast Florida Regional Climate Action Plan as approved by the Broward County Climate Change Task Force, and ~~adopted by~~ the Broward County Board of County Commissioners.
