SECOND AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT BETWEEN BROWARD COUNTY AND BROWARD PARTNERSHIP FOR THE HOMELESS, INC., D/B/A BROWARD PARTNERSHIP, FOR PERMANENT SUPPORTIVE HOUSING AND RAPID REHOUSING FOR INDIVIDUALS AND FAMILIES

Agreement #22-CP-HIP-8666-02

This is a second amendment ("Second Amendment") to an agreement between Broward County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida ("County"), and Broward Partnership for the Homeless, Inc., d/b/a Broward Partnership, an active Florida nonprofit corporation ("Provider"), for Permanent Supportive Housing and Rapid Rehousing for Individuals and Families (the "Agreement"). County and Provider are each a "Party" and collectively referred to as the "Parties."

RECITALS

- A. The Parties entered into the original Agreement on September 29, 2022.
- B. The Parties subsequently amended the Agreement through a First Amendment on October 23, 2023, to delete the "Permanent Supportive Housing Pompano Beach Encampment" program and provide the maximum funding amount for Option Period 1.
- C. The Parties are currently in Option Period 1 and now desire to amend the Agreement to delete the "Rapid Rehousing Individuals and Families" program; decrease the Agreement's maximum funding amount by \$220,000, from \$540,000 to \$320,000, for Option Period 1; and update the Agreement Specifications and Outcomes exhibits.

Now, therefore, for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1. The Agreement is hereby amended to delete Exhibit D-1, Scope of Services, Program #2, Rapid Rehousing Individuals and Families, in its entirety.
- 2. Exhibit A, Agreement Specifications, Section III., Maximum Funding Amounts, of the Agreement is amended as follows:
 - III. Maximum Funding Amounts:

A. ...

B. Option Period 1: \$540,000

Program #1: \$320,000 Program #2:-\$220,000

C. Option Period 2: \$1,240,000 \$320,000

D. Extension: Equal to a pro rata amount of the then-existing annual

funding amount

- 3. Exhibit D-2, Outcomes, Revision #1, of the Agreement is revised and replaced in its entirety with the attached Exhibit D-2, Outcomes, Revision #2.
- 4. The title of the Agreement is amended as follows: "Agreement between Broward County and Broward Partnership for the Homeless, Inc., d/b/a Broward Partnership, for Permanent Supportive Housing and Rapid Rehousing for Individuals and Families."
- 5. In the event of any conflict or ambiguity between this Second Amendment and the Agreement (as previously amended), the Parties agree that this Second Amendment will control.
- 6. This Second Amendment is effective October 1, 2023. Except as expressly amended, all terms and conditions of the Agreement remain in full force and effect.
- 7. The Parties have jointly prepared this Second Amendment.
