AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, PERTAINING TO GARBAGE COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL OF SOLID WASTE; REPEALING SECTIONS 14-78 THROUGH 14-84 OF THE BROWARD COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES ("CODE"); CREATING NEW SECTIONS 14-78 THROUGH 14-84 OF THE CODE; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

The proposed Ordinance repeals Sections 14-78 through 14-84 of the Code and replaces them with language reflecting more modern definitions of key terminology relating to the trash collection industry, provides for the Board to be able to establish minimum and maximum collection fees that may be charged to residents in the unincorporated areas, and updates the provisions relating to the issuance of licenses by the County to trash haulers who will operate in the Open Market Area within the unincorporated portions of Broward County. 2.
