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1	AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD
2	COUNTY, FLORIDA, PERTAINING TO NOISE; AMENDING VARIOUS SECTIONS OF
3	ARTICLE VII OF CHAPTER 27 OF THE BROWARD COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES
4	("CODE") RELATING TO NOISE GENERATED BY FACILITIES AUTHORIZED TO
5	OPERATE WITH A BROWARD COUNTY AIR LICENSE OR STATE OF FLORIDA AIR
6	PERMIT; AMENDING SECTION 39-133 OF THE CODE RELATED TO NOISE
7	DISTURBANCES; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE CODE,
8	AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

11	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF
12	BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:
13	Section 1. Article VII of Chapter 27 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances
14	is hereby amended to read as follows:
15	ARTICLE VII. NOISE
16	
17	Sec. 27-232. Applicability.
18	(a) This article shall apply and shall be enforceable to excessive sound
19	originating from sources within the boundaries of Broward County, unless otherwise
20	provided herein generated by facilities authorized to operate with a Broward County air
21	license or State of Florida air permit.

22 (b) This article shall apply to excessive sound generated from the following

23 property categories:

24 (1)Industrial/manufacturing facilities; 25 (2)Commercial/business facilities; 26 (3)Government facilities; 27 (4) Community service facilities; 28 (5) Public and private rights-of-way; 29 (6) Residential properties under construction. 30 (c) This article shall apply to excessive sound received at the following property 31 categories: 32 **Residential properties;** (1)33 (2)Commercial/business facilities: 34 Government facilities; (3)35 (4)Community service facilities. 36 Sec. 27-233. Documents adopted by reference. 37 (a) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this article, the following provisions 38 of the United States Code of Federal Regulations, as amended, are adopted and 39 incorporated herein by reference: Noise Emission Standards for Transportation 40 Equipment, Interstate Rail Carriers, 40 C.F.R. Part 201; and Railroad Noise Emission 41 Compliance Regulations, 49 C.F.R. Part 210. References to any other parts, sections or 42 other provisions of the Code of Federal Regulations or of the United States Code include 43 any amended and/or renumbered versions of such parts, sections or other provisions.

44 (b) The American Society for Testing and Material (ASTM), Standard Guide for
45 Measurement of Outdoor A-weighted Sound Level, E 1014-84 (re-approved 2000), as
46 amended, is adopted and incorporated by reference.

47 Sec. 27-234. Definitions.

All acoustical terminology used in this article shall be in conformance with the
ASTM, Standard Terminology Relating to Environmental Acoustics, C634- 02, as
amended.

51 (1) *Construction* means any site preparation, assembly, erection, substantial repair, 52 alteration, or similar action, on public or private rights-of-way, structures, utilities, or 53 similar property.

54 (2) *Demolition* means any dismantling, intentional destruction, or removal of 55 structures, utilities, public or private right-of-way surfaces, or similar property.

56 (3) *Emergency* means any occurrence or set of circumstances involving actual or 57 imminent physical trauma or property damage which that demands immediate action.

58 (4) *Emergency work* means any work performed for the purpose of preventing or 59 alleviating the physical trauma or property damage threatened or caused by an 60 emergency.

61 (5) *Excessive sound or <u>or</u> noise* means sound occurring in the environment that is
 62 annoying, disturbing, or harmful.

63 (6) *L50 sound level* means the sound level exceeded fifty (50) percent of the time,
64 based on any measurement period of not less than ten (10) minutes.

65 (7) *Person* means any natural person, individual, owner, operator, public or private 66 corporation, firm, association, joint venture, partnership, municipality, governmental

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agency, political subdivision, public officer, responsible party, or any other entity
whatsoever or any combination thereof, of whatever kind.

69 (8) *Public right-of-way* means any street, avenue, boulevard, highway, sidewalk or
 70 alley, or similar transportation corridor normally accessible to the public which is owned
 71 or controlled by a governmental entity.

72 (9) *Private right-of-way* means any street, avenue, boulevard, highway, sidewalk or
 73 alley, or similar transportation corridor normally accessible to the public which is owned
 74 or controlled by a non-governmental entity.

75 (10) *Public space* means any real property or structures thereon normally accessible to
76 the public.

77 (11) *Real property* means land and all immovable structures attached to the land.

78 (12) *Real property line* means either:

- Any imaginary line along the surface, and its vertical plane extension, which
 separates one parcel of real property from another; or
- b. On a <u>multi-use multiuse</u> property, the interface between the two portions of
 the property on which different categories of activity are being performed.

83 (13) Sound means an oscillation in pressure, particle displacement, particle velocity, or
 84 other physical parameter, in a medium with internal forces that causes compression and
 85 rarefaction of that medium. The description of sound may include any characteristic of
 86 such sound, including duration, intensity, and frequency.

87 (14) Sound level meter means an instrument which includes a microphone, amplifier,
 88 RMS detector, integrator or time averaged, output meter, and weighting networks used
 89 to measure sound pressure levels. The output meter reads sound pressure levels when

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properly calibrated, and the instrument is of a Type-2 or better, as specified in the
 American National Standards Institute (ANSI) publication SI.4-1971, or its successor
 publications.

93 <u>Unreasonably loud noise means uninvited noise that is plainly audible inside of a</u>
 94 receiving property with doors and windows closed, across a property line, and that
 95 interferes with a person's peaceful enjoyment of real property or the peace and tranquility
 96 of the surrounding neighborhood.

97 Sec. 27-235. Prohibitions.

98 (a) No person shall operate or cause to be operated any source of sound on 99 any property listed in Sec. 27-232(b) in such manner as to create a sound level which 100 exceeds either the L50 sound level limit or the Lmax sound level limit as set forth in 101 Table 1 when measured at or within the real property line of any of the receiving properties 102 listed in Table 1, unless otherwise specified Any unreasonably loud noise originating from a facility authorized to operate with a Broward County air license or State of Florida air 103 104 permit shall be deemed a violation of this section. 175	Sound level measurements shall be made in accordance with ASTM Standard
176	Guide for Measurement of Outdoor A-weighted Sound Level, E 1014-84 (re-approved
177	2000).
178	Section 2. Section 39-133 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby
179	amended to read as follows:
180	Sec. 39-133. Duty to maintain property; nuisances.

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182 Nothing shall be allowed on or in any structure, land, or water body in any (g) 183 district that shall in any way be offensive or obnoxious, based upon a reasonable person 184 standard, by reason of the emission of odors, gases, dust, smoke, vibrations, or noise 185 (including the crowing of cocks, barking of dogs, or any noises or odors emanating from 186 any animal, fish, or fowl), taking into account the nature, frequency, intensity, duration, 187 and time of day, as well as the surrounding ambient conditions. Nor shall anything be 188 constructed or maintained that would in any way constitute an eyesore to adjacent 189 property owners or residents, or the community, based upon a reasonable person 190 standard. Noise violations shall be determined based upon the provisions of Chapter 27, 191 Article VII, of the Broward County Code of Ordinances and this section. Uninvited noise 192 shall be deemed unreasonably loud if it is plainly audible inside of a receiving property 193 with doors and windows closed, across a property line, and interferes with a person's 194 peaceful enjoyment of a residence or the peace and tranquility of the surrounding 195 neighborhood ("Unreasonably Loud Noise"). 240	violation of these provisions shall be investigated and determined by a code enforcement
241	officer. Enforcement of alleged violations of this $cCode$ shall be pursuant to Chapter 8½
242	of the Broward County Code of Ordinances.
243	Section 3. Severability.
244	If any portion of this Ordinance is determined by any court to be invalid, the invalid
245	portion will be stricken, and such striking will not affect the validity of the remainder of this
246	Ordinance. If any court determines that this Ordinance, in whole or in part, cannot be

247 legally applied to any individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such

248 determination will not affect the applicability of this Ordinance to any other individual,249 group, entity, property, or circumstance.

250 Section 4. Inclusion in the Broward County Code of Ordinances.

251 It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners that the provisions of this
252 Ordinance become part of the Broward County Code of Ordinances as of the effective
253 date. The sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered and the word
254 "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or such other appropriate word or
255 phrase to the extent necessary to accomplish such intention.

Section 5. Effective Date.

This Ordinance is effective as of the date provided by law.
