11	clarify definitions and the scope of criminal history screening practices for vendors awarded

14	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD				
15	COUNTY, FLORIDA:

17	Section 1. Section 26-125 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby				
18	amended to read as follows:				
19	Sec. 26-125. Criminal history screening practices.				
20	(a) Definitions.				
21	Applicant means, as applicable, a person who applies for employment with Broward				
22	2 County <u>or with a vendor</u> .				
23	Broward County means the government of Broward County, and its departments,				
24	divisions, and offices.

Criminal history means any information related to (a) an arrest or criminal charges
 against the applicant, (b) proceedings related to the applicant's arrest or criminal charges, or
 (c) disposition of the applicant's arrest or criminal charges.

Criminal history background check means requesting, with a goal of obtaining,
information about an applicant's criminal history from third party sources.

Finalist means an applicant who has been preliminarily determined by Broward County
or a vendor, as applicable, to meet the qualifications for the position and has interviewed for
the position.

9 *Initial application for employment* means any document, whether in paper or electronic
10 form, that Broward County <u>or a vendor, as applicable,</u> requires an applicant <u>to</u> submit to
11 express the applicant's interest in County employment.

12 *Position* means the particular job with Broward County sought by the applicant.

13 *Vendor* means an actual supplier or potential supplier of goods or services to Broward14 County.

17 As part of the competitive solicitation process, a vendor seeking a contract in (1) 18 the amount of \$100,000 or more with Broward County, in the amount of 19 \$100,000 or more, shall certify that it has implemented, or will implement upon 20 award of the contract, policies, practices, and procedures regarding inquiry into 21 the criminal history of an applicant for employment, including a criminal history 22 background check of any such person, that preclude inquiry into an applicant's 23 criminal history until the applicant is selected as a finalist and interviewed for 24 the position. The requirement in the preceding sentence shall apply only to

6	(2) Exce	ptions. The requirements under Section 26-125(d) are not applicable if:	
7	a.	The vendor is required by applicable federal, state, or local law to	
8		conduct a criminal history background check in connection with	
9		potential employment at a time or in a manner that would otherwise be	
10		prohibited by this section;	
11	b.	The applicable contract is not a competitive solicitation or is exempt	
12		from Chapter 21 of the Broward County Administrative Code;	
13	С.	The vendor is a governmental agency; or	
14	d.	The Broward County Board of County Commissioners determines that	
15		it is in the best interests of Broward County to waive the requirements	
16		of Section 26-125(d) for the applicable contract or vendor.

18	Section 2.	<u>Severability</u> .	
19	If any portio	n of this Ordinance is determined by any court to be invalid, the invalid	
20	portion will be stricken, and such striking will not affect the validity of the remainder of this		
21	Ordinance. If any court determines that this Ordinance, in whole or in part, cannot be legally		
22	applied to any individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such determination will not		
23	affect the applicability of this Ordinance to any other individual, group, entity, property, or		
24	circumstance.

5	may be changed to "section," "article," or such other appropriate word or phrase to the extent			
6	necessary in order to accomplish such intention.			
7	Section 4. <u>Effective Date</u> .			
8	This Ordinance is effective as of the date provided by law. The amendments to this			
9	Ordinance shall apply prospectively only and shall not apply to solicitations advertised by			
10	Broward County prior to the effective date of this Ordinance.
