ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, PERTAINING TO PRIVATE PARKING TICKETS; REPEALING SECTION 20-164.2 OF THE BROWARD COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES ("CODE"); AMENDING SECTION 8½-16 OF THE CODE REGARDING CIVIL PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS OF SECTION 20-164.2; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

(Sponsored by the Board of County Commissioners)

WHEREAS, on September 21, 2021, the Broward County Board of County Commissioners ("Board") enacted an Ordinance creating Section 20-164.2 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances to prohibit private parking facilities from issuing private parking tickets to motor vehicles; and

WHEREAS, during the 2022 legislative session, the Legislature enacted Committee Substitute/Senate Bill 1380, which prohibits counties and municipalities from enacting ordinances restricting private property owners or operators from establishing their own rules and rates to govern private parking on their property, and declares all prohibited local ordinances null and void,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Section 1. Section 20-164.2 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby repealed in its entirety.

1 Section 2. Section 8½-16 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby
2 amended to read as follows:

15 Section 3. Severability.

16 If any portion of this Ordinance is determined by any court to be invalid, the invalid
17 portion will be stricken, and such striking will not affect the validity of the remainder of this
18 Ordinance. If any court determines that this Ordinance, in whole or in part, cannot be
19 legally applied to any individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such
20 determination will not affect the applicability of this Ordinance to any other individual,
21 group, entity, property, or circumstance.

1 Section 4. Inclusion in the Broward County Code of Ordinances.

2 It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners that the provisions of this
3 Ordinance become part of the Broward County Code of Ordinances as of the effective
4 date. The sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered and the word
5 "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or such other appropriate word or
6 phrase to the extent necessary in order to accomplish such intention.
