RESOLUTION NO. 2020-

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, PERTAINING TO THE NORTH PERRY AIRPORT COMMUNITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE; AMENDING SECTION 12.36 OF THE BROWARD COUNTY ADMINISTRATIVE CODE (“ADMINISTRATIVE CODE”); AMENDING A CATEGORY OF MEMBERSHIP AND CREATING AN EXCEPTION FOR THE RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT FOR MEMBERS OF SPECIFIED CATEGORIES; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE ADMINISTRATIVE CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the North Perry Airport Community Advisory Committee (“Committee”) was created to advise the Broward County Aviation Department about community interests and issues concerning the North Perry Airport (“Airport”);

WHEREAS, the North Perry Airport Community Association is the correct category of membership that should be listed in Section 12.36(a)(6);

WHEREAS, potential nominees for the Committee with significant knowledge and expertise regarding the issues concerning the Airport may not reside in Broward County, Florida; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners desires to amend the category of membership in Section 12.36(a)(6) and modify the residency requirement for certain categories of Committee members, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Section 1. Section 12.36 of the Broward County Administrative Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

1 **12.36. Membership.**

2 (a) The Committee shall consist of the following nine (9) members nominated
3 as stated below and appointed by the Broward County Board of County Commissioners
4 (the "Board"):

5 (1) One (1) resident from the City of Pembroke Pines;

6 (2) One (1) resident from the City of Hollywood;

7 (3) One (1) resident from the City of Miramar;

8 (4) One (1) member from the Airport Traffic Control Tower;

9 (5) One (1) member from the Miramar Pembroke Pines Regional Chamber of
10 Commerce;

11 (6) One (1) member from the ~~Airport Tenant Advisory Committee~~ North Perry
12 Airport Community Association;

13 (7) One (1) member from the City of Pembroke Pines Planning & Economic
14 Development Department;

15 (8) One (1) member from the City of Miramar Planning & Redevelopment
16 Division; and

17 (9) One (1) member from the City of Hollywood Division of Planning and Urban
18 Design.

19 (b) The members for the categories identified in Sections 12.36(a)(1)-(3) shall
20 be significantly familiar with the Airport-related impacts of their respective municipalities
21 and shall be nominated by a County Commissioner representing residents of that
22 municipality whose district is adjacent to the Airport.

23 (c) The members for the categories identified in Sections 12.36(a)(4)-(9) may
24 be nominated by any member of the Board. The residency requirement of

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1 Section 1-233(b)(1) of the Broward County Code of Ordinances shall not apply to the
2 members for the categories identified in Sections 12.36(a)(4)-(9).

3 (d) The Committee shall include six (6) alternate members nominated by any
4 member of the Board and appointed by the Board for each of the categories listed in
5 Sections 12.36(a)(4)-(9), each of whom may serve in place of the respective primary
6 member when the primary member is unable to attend the Committee meeting. Each
7 alternate member shall only serve within his or her respective category as listed in
8 Sections 12.36(a)(4)-(9).

9 (e) All appointments to the Committee shall be made by the Board consistent
10 with Section 1-233 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances.

11 (f) Alternates shall attend the Committee meetings, but shall not be counted
12 towards the quorum or vote unless the respective primary member is absent.

13 (g) Unless otherwise provided for in this Part IV, members of the Committee
14 shall serve in accordance with Section 1-233 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances.

15 Section 2. Severability.

16 If any portion of this Administrative Code Resolution is determined by any court to
17 be invalid, the invalid portion will be stricken, and such striking will not affect the validity
18 of the remainder of this Administrative Code Resolution. If any court determines that this
19 Administrative Code Resolution, in whole or in part, cannot be legally applied to any
20 individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such determination will not affect the
21 applicability of this Administrative Code Resolution to any other individual, group, entity,
22 property, or circumstance.
