18	WHEREAS, Chapter 27 of the Broward County Administrative Code
19	("Administrative Code") establishes the operational policies for the Broward County
20	Environmental Protection and Growth Management Department; and
21	WHEREAS, it has become necessary to amend Chapter 27 of the Administrative
22	Code to reflect changes in the Broward County Land Development Code and in the
23	procedures for processing plats and amendments to the Broward County Land Use Plan,
24	NOW, THEREFORE,

Section 1. Section 27.13 of the Broward County Administrative Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

27.13. Procedure for Amendments to the Future Land Use Map of the Unincorporated Area Land Use Element-The Element; The Future Land Use Map of the Broward County Land Use Plan for Land wWithin the Unincorporated Area.

d. After review by the appropriate agencies, the Planning and Development Management Division Environmental Protection and Growth Management Department, as the local planning agency, shall hold at least one (1) public hearing, with due public notice as defined by Section 163.3164, Florida Statutes, and required by Subsection 163.3174(4)(a), Florida Statutes. The Planning and Development Management Division Environmental Protection and Growth Management Department, as the local planning agency, shall adopt a recommendation at a public hearing and forward that recommendation to the Board of County Commissioners. The recommendation of the Planning and Development Management Division Environmental Protection and Growth Management Department shall be made directly to the Board of County Commissioners at the transmittal public hearing (transmitting the proposed amendments to the Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO) and other entities, if applicable, pursuant to Section 163.3184, Florida Statutes), or at the adoption public hearing (for a small scale land use plan amendment), if the amendment is only to the

Future Unincorporated Area Land Use Element. If the amendment to the Future Unincorporated Area Land Use Element also requires an amendment to the Broward County Land Use Plan, the recommendation shall be forwarded to the Board of County Commissioners for transmittal to the Broward County Planning Council, along with the Board's Board of County Commissioners' transmittal of a proposed amendment of the Broward County Land Use Plan to the Planning Council.

e. The Board of County Commissioners shall, by motion and without the need for a public hearing, transmit a proposed map amendment to the Broward County Land Use Plan for the Unincorporated Area to the Planning Council. The transmittal shall include the recommendation of the Planning and Development Management Division Environmental Protection and Growth Management Department on the proposed amendment.

- g. Except for small scale land use plan amendments, ‡the Board of County Commissioners shall hold a transmittal public hearing and process the application as required by Chapter 163, Section 163.3184, Florida Statutes.
- h. Following receipt of written comments from DEO or other applicable entities pursuant to Section 163.3184, Florida Statutes, the Planning Council shall, if deemed necessary by the Planning Council or the Board of County Commissioners, give due public notice and conduct a second public hearing on proposed map amendments to the Broward County Land Use Plan and shall make a recommendation on proposed amendments to the Board of County Commissioners.
- i. Following receipt of written comments from DEO and other applicable entities, the Planning and Development Management Division Environmental Protection

and Growth Management Department may conduct a public hearing with due public notice to consider any or all proposed map amendments to the Future Land Use Map for the Unincorporated Area Land Use Plan.

j- h. Within the time frame set forth within Section 163.3184, Florida Statutes, after receipt of the written comments from the DEO or other applicable entities, or pursuant to Section 163.3187, Florida Statutes, for small scale amendments, the Board of County Commissioners shall schedule and hold the second a public hearing at which it shall take formal and final action on the proposed amendments. The recommendation of the Planning and Development Management Division Environmental Protection and Growth Management Department, the Planning Council, and comments from DEO and other applicable entities, as applicable, shall be available to the Board of County Commissioners at the adoption public hearing.

k. i. All amendments to the Broward County Comprehensive Plan shall be adopted by ordinance.

Section 2. Section 27.14 of the Broward County Administrative Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

27.14. Procedure for Amendments to the Future Land Use Map for the Unincorporated Area Land Use Element and the Future Land Use Map for the Broward County Land Use Plan for Land wWithin the Unincorporated Area wWhere the Proposed Amendment is Directly Related to a Development of Regional Impact.

Map amendments relating to Developments of Regional Impact in the Unincorporated Area shall be processed in the same manner as described in Section 27.13 for other map amendments with the following exceptions:

a. The application for such amendments may be submitted any time after the application for development approval has been filed with the County and the Regional Planning Council. The decision whether to consider the amendment outside usual twice a year amendment schedule shall be at the discretion of the Planning Council and the Board of County Commissioners.

Section 3. Section 27.40 of the Broward County Administrative Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

## Sec. 27.40. Transportation Concurrency Assessment Calculation.

The Transportation Concurrency Assessment, as specified in Section 5-182(a)(5) 5-182.1 of the Land Development Code, shall be calculated by using the Trip Generation Rates contained in Appendix A of this Chapter, together with the Fee Schedule contained in Appendix B of this Chapter current edition of the Institute of Transportation Engineers (ITE) Trip Generation Manual. The Assessment shall be the product of the following three factors:

- 1. The peak-hour peak hour trip generation, from Appendix A;
- 2. The cost per trip for the appropriate District, from Appendix B; and
- 3. The appropriate trip length factor from Appendix B.
