## PROPOSED

### RESOLUTION NO. 2021-

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, PERTAINING TO RATES, FEES, AND CHARGES AT FORT LAUDERDALE-HOLLYWOOD INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT ("AIRPORT"); AMENDING SECTION 39.2 OF THE BROWARD COUNTY ADMINISTRATIVE CODE ("ADMINISTRATIVE CODE"); MODIFYING AND ESTABLISHING CERTAIN FEES AT THE AIRPORT; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE ADMINISTRATIVE CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Section 2-3 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances requires the Broward County Board of County Commissioners (the "Board") to establish, through the adoption of a resolution, the rates, fees, and charges for the services and facilities provided at the Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport ("Airport"); and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to amend Section 39.2 of the Broward County Administrative Code to modify and establish certain fees at the Airport, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Section 1. Section 39.2 of the Broward County Administrative Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

**39.2. Rates, Fees, and Charges — Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport.**

e. Security Charges.

1. Charges for Airport Issued Identification Media:

19	(f) (e)	Reassessment of fees. The Director of Aviation or	
20		designee shall have the authority to adjust the	
21		foregoing security charges to recover future costs of	
22		processing identification badges and conducting	
23		background checks.

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1 n. Lost Keys. There shall be a charge for replacing lost or damaged keys, lost  
2 or damaged padlocks, and changing out key cores ~~in the Terminals at the Airport~~, as  
3 follows:

4 1. Per key charge for lost ~~or unaccounted for~~ key,  
5 unaccounted for, or damaged keys:

6 (a) Brass Key ..... \$ 50.00

7 (b) Electronic Key ..... 90.00

8 2. Per core charge due to Core change due to ~~for~~ lost, or  
9 unaccounted for, or damaged keys, per ~~or~~ cores:

10 (a) Brass Key Core ..... 45.00

11 (b) Electronic Key Core ..... 200.00

12 3. Electronic padlock charge for lost, unaccounted for, or  
13 damaged padlock ..... 210.00

14 ~~3.~~ 4. Lock Out Fee ..... 25.00

15 4. 5. Reassessment of fees. The Director of Aviation or designee  
16 shall have the authority to adjust the foregoing fees for lost,  
17 unaccounted for, or damaged keys and cores ~~fees~~ to recover  
18 future costs of providing keys and cores.

20 Section 2. Severability.

21 If any portion of this Administrative Code Resolution is determined by any court to  
22 be invalid, the invalid portion will be stricken, and such striking will not affect the validity  
23 of the remainder of this Administrative Code Resolution. If any court determines that this  
24 Administrative Code Resolution, in whole or in part, cannot be legally applied to any

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1 individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such determination will not affect the  
2 applicability of this Administrative Code Resolution to any other individual, group, entity,  
3 property, or circumstance.

4 Section 3. Inclusion in the Broward County Administrative Code.

5 It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners that the provisions of this  
6 Administrative Code Resolution become part of the Broward County Administrative Code  
7 as of the effective date. The sections of this Administrative Code Resolution may be  
8 renumbered or relettered and the word "resolution" may be changed to "section," "article,"  
9 or such other appropriate word or phrase to the extent necessary in order to accomplish  
10 such intention.

11 Section 4. Effective Date.

12 This Administrative Code Resolution is effective upon adoption.
