Summary Explanation/Background

THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AND GROWTH MANAGEMENT DEPARTMENT AND THE PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT MANAGEMENT DIVISION RECOMMEND APPROVAL OF THE ABOVE MOTION.

The Planning and Development Management Division has received a request to vacate a portion of a 20-foot utility easement lying within Parcel A of Motorola Plat, as recorded in Plat Book 101, Page 14 of the Public Records of Broward County, located at 1702 North University Drive in the City of Plantation.

Vacating this easement will provide clear and unencumbered title to the property owner. The City of Plantation adopted Resolution No. 12835 on October 21, 2020 granting approval of the abandonment and vacation of the utility easement. Review of this application by the applicable reviewing agencies indicates that there is no objection to the abandonment and vacation of the subject easement.
