### Information

#### **Requested Action**

**MOTION TO ADOPT** budget Resolution transferring funds within the Law Enforcement Trust Fund (LETf) for the Broward Sheriff's Office (BSO) in the amount of \$930,000 for the purpose of providing funds for various organizations' crime prevention, safe neighborhood, and drug abuse education and prevention programs.

#### **Why Action is Necessary**

Florida Statutes 932.7055(5)(a) requires that proceeds from the disposition of liens and forfeited property obtained from criminal procedure and corrections be deposited in a special law enforcement trust fund to be used for law enforcement purposes. Recommendation of the Sheriff and Board approval are required to appropriate LETf funds.

#### **What Action Accomplishes**

Provides LETf funding in the amount of \$930,000 for various organizations' crime prevention, safe neighborhood, and drug abuse education and prevention programs.

#### **Fiscal Impact/Cost Summary**

Funds are available within the Law Enforcement Trust Fund for these actions. According to BSO, the current balance of the LETf, as of July 28, 2022, is \$5,124,787 in the local account (\$3,788,367 of

which is unrestricted) and \$4,667,048 in the federal account (\$2,770,903 of which is unrestricted). This action will utilize \$930,000 in unrestricted local funds.
