In accordance with Section 112.313(12), Florida Statutes, the Board may waive any conflict arising under Section 112.313(7)(a), Florida Statutes, by a two-thirds vote after full disclosure of the conflicting relationship. Florida Commission on Ethics Form 4A, Disclosure of Business Transaction, Relationship or Interest, is attached hereto as Exhibit 1 and constitutes full disclosure of any existing conflicts.
