Summary Explanation/Background

The Planning Council, as the Local Planning Agency (LPA) responsible for the Broward County Land Use Plan, considered the following proposed map amendment, PC 21-3, at its January 28, 2021, public hearing and **recommended approval of an Irregular (35.3) Residential designation (rather than High (50) Residential), including not requiring a second Planning Council public hearing, and recognizing the applicant's voluntary commitment to restrict development to a maximum of 501 dwelling units** (Vote of the Planning Council; 14-2; Yes: Breslau, Brunson, Castillo, Fernandez, Gomez, Graham, Hardin, Maxey, Railey, Rich, Rosenof, Ryan, Williams and DiGiorgio. No: Blackwelder and Grosso.):

AMENDMENT PC 21-3

Amendment to the Broward County Land Use Plan - City of Lauderhill

From Commerce to High (50) Residential

Approximately 14.2 acres; generally located on the west side of University Drive, between Commercial Boulevard and Inverrary Boulevard/Northwest 50 Street.
