## **Information**

#### Requested Action

<u>MOTION TO AUTHORIZE</u> Port Everglades Department to reimburse the Broward Sheriff's Office ("BSO") for the 25% Cost Share in the Fiscal Year 2018 Port Security Grant awarded to BSO in an amount up to \$112,500 to purchase Fire Suppression Foam Concentrate for fire protection at Port Everglades.

#### Why Action is Necessary

Board action is required to authorize the Port Everglades Department to reimburse BSO for the 25% cost share for the Fiscal Year 2018 Port Security Grant awarded by the Federal Emergency Management Agency ("FEMA") for fire protection at Port Everglades.

#### What Action Accomplishes

Authorizes Port Everglades to reimburse BSO for the local cost share for the Fiscal Year 2018 Port Security Grant Program awarded to BSO for firefighting foam purchase.

## Summary Explanation/Background

THE PORT EVERGLADES DEPARTMENT RECOMMENDS APPROVAL.

The Broward Sheriff's Office (BSO) was awarded \$337,500 by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) in the Fiscal Year 2018 Port Security Grant Program to purchase a new supply of 1% x 3% firefighting foam for petroleum and marine firefighting at Port Everglades. As part of the grant agreement with FEMA, BSO is responsible for a 25% cost match of the total \$450,000 project cost, or \$112,500. Since this specialized foam is only needed to fight fires at Port Everglades, the Port Everglades Department has agreed to reimburse BSO for the 25% cost share in an amount up to \$112,500. BSO anticipates purchasing up to 12,000 gallons of foam concentrate with the grant funds.

The purchase of 1% x 3% firefighting foam will upgrade the current foam supply at the Port. This new foam concentrate will allow less foam to be used for the suppression of a petroleum or marine fire using the same volume of water, thus increasing the total amount of foam available to suppress such

fires.
