MOTION TO ADOPT Resolution No. 2020-539 directing the County Administrator to publish Notice of Public Hearing to be held on Tuesday, December 1, 2020 at 10:00 a.m. in Room 422 of the Governmental Center, 115 South Andrews Avenue, Fort Lauderdale, Florida to vacate a portion of a 50-foot right-of-way, known as Harding Street, lying within Hollywood Acres, as recorded in Plat Book 25, Page 1 of the Public Records of Broward County and is located at 1841 North State Road 7 in the City of Hollywood; Petitioners: Triangle Auto Center, Inc.; Agent: Jane Storms, Publice Land Surveyors, Inc.; Application for Vacation and Abandonment: 2018-V-25. (Commission District 6)

Why Action is Necessary

Board approval is required to vacate plats, easements and rights-of-way pursuant to Chapter 5, Article IX of the Broward County Code of Ordinances.

Summary Explanation/Background

THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AND GROWTH MANAGEMENT DEPARTMENT AND THE PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT MANAGEMENT DIVISION RECOMMEND APPROVAL OF THE ABOVE MOTION.

The Planning and Development Management Division has received a request to vacate a portion of a 50-foot right-of-way, known as Harding Street, lying within Hollywood Acres, as recorded in Plat Book 25, Page 1 of the Public Records of Broward County and is located at 1841 North State Road 7 in the City of Hollywood. Vacating this right-of-way will provide clear and unencumbered title to the property owner.

The City of Hollywood adopted Ordinance No. O-2018-12 on June 16, 2018 granting approval of the

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abandonment and vacation of the 50-foot right-of-way. Review of this application by the applicable reviewing agencies indicates that there is no objection to the abandonment and vacation of the subject right-of-way.

This vacation application has been reviewed and approved as to form by the Office of the County Attorney (Exhibit 1).

In the event Executive Order 20-69 is not extended by the Governor, staff will revise the public notice accordingly before placing an advertisement before the December 1, 2020 hearing. See Exhibit 3 for the Public Notice.
