The Planning and Development Management Division has received a request to vacate a 70-foot private access easement lying within Parcel A of Port Everglades Plat No. 12, as recorded in Plat Book 153, Page 31 of the Public Records of Broward County and is located at 3500 Southeast 18 Avenue in the City of Hollywood. Vacating this easement will provide clear and unencumbered title to Broward County (as the property owner).

The City of Hollywood adopted Resolution No. R-2019-341 on November 20, 2019 granting approval

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of the abandonment and vacation of the 70-foot private access easement. Review of this application by the applicable reviewing agencies indicates that there is no objection to the abandonment and vacation of the subject easement.
