<u>MOTION TO ADOPT</u> Resolution No. 2021-003 directing the County Administrator to publish Notice of Public Hearing to be held on Tuesday, February 9, 2021, at 10:00 a.m. in Room 422 of the Governmental Center, 115 South Andrews Avenue, Fort Lauderdale, Florida to vacate a 50-foot utility easement lying within Tract A of Plantation Plaza Plat, as recorded in Plat Book 68, Page 25 and a variable width utility easement lying within Tract A of Swindell's Subdivision No. 2 Plat, as recorded in Plat Book 68, Page 32 of the Public Records of Broward County and located at 311 North State Road 7 in the City of Plantation; Petitioners: Plantation Apartments, L.P.: Craven Thompson and Associates Inc.; Application for Vacation and Abandonment: 2020-V-10. (Commission District 9)

Why Action is Necessary

Board approval is required to vacate plats, all or in part, pursuant to Chapter 5, Article IX of the Broward County Code of Ordinances.

What Action Accomplishes

Directs the County Administrator to publish a Notice of Public Hearing for the abandonment of easements in accordance with Chapter 5, Article IX of the Broward County Code of Ordinances.

Summary Explanation/Background

THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AND GROWTH MANAGEMENT DEPARTMENT AND THE PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT MANAGEMENT DIVISION RECOMMEND APPROVAL OF THE ABOVE MOTION.

The Planning and Development Management Division has received a request to vacate a portion of a 50-foot utility easement lying within Tract A of Plantation Plaza, as recorded in Plat Book 68, Page 25 and a variable width utility easement lying within Tract A of Swindell's Subdivision No. 2 Plat, as recorded in Plat Book 68, Page 32 of the Public Records of Broward County, located at 311 North State Road 7 in the City of Plantation. Vacating these easements will provide clear and unencumbered title to the property owner.

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The letter from the City of Plantation dated January 15, 2020 indicates no objection to the requested vacation.

Review of this application by the applicable reviewing agencies indicates that there is no objection to the abandonment and vacation of the subject easements.
