<u>MOTION TO ADOPT</u> Resolution No. 2021-004 directing the County Administrator to publish Notice of Public Hearing to be held on Tuesday, February 9, 2021, at 10:00 a.m. in Room 422 of the Governmental Center, 115 South Andrews Avenue, Fort Lauderdale, Florida to vacate a portion of a ten-foot utility easement lying within Parcel A of Lanzo Industrial Center Plat, as recorded in Plat Book 111, Page 14 of the Public Records of Broward County and located at 4251 Northwest 19 Avenue in the City of Deerfield Beach; Petitioners: Crystal Lake Commerce Center LLC: Kalis Kleiman and Wolfe.; Application for Vacation and Abandonment: 2020-V-12. (Commission District 4)

Summary Explanation/Background

THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AND GROWTH MANAGEMENT DEPARTMENT AND THE PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT MANAGEMENT DIVISION RECOMMEND APPROVAL OF THE ABOVE MOTION.

The Planning and Development Management Division has received a request to vacate a portion of a ten-foot utility easement lying within Parcel A of Lanzo Industrial Center Plat, as recorded in Plat Book 111, Page 14 of the Public Records of Broward County, located at 4251 Northwest 19 Avenue in the City of Deerfield Beach. Vacating this utility easement will provide clear and unencumbered title to the property owner.

The City of Deerfield Beach adopted Ordinance No. 2020-136 on October 6, 2020 granting approval of the abandonment and vacation of the utility easement.

Review of this application by the applicable reviewing agencies indicates that there is no objection to the abandonment and vacation of the subject easement.
