MOTION TO ENACT Ordinance, the title of which is as follows: (Continued from June 7, 2022 - Item No. 56)

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, PERTAINING TO PRIVATE PARKING TICKETS; REPEALING SECTION 20-164.2 OF THE BROWARD COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES ("CODE"); AMENDING SECTION 8½-16 OF THE CODE REGARDING CIVIL PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS OF SECTION 20-164.2; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

#### Summary Explanation/Background

On September 21, 2021, the Board enacted an Ordinance creating Section 20-164.2 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances prohibiting private parking facilities from issuing private parking tickets to motor vehicles. During the 2022 legislative session, the Legislature enacted Committee Substitute/Senate Bill 1380 ("CS/SB 1380"), which prohibits counties and municipalities from enacting ordinances restricting private property owners or operators from establishing their own rules and rates to govern private parking on their property. CS/SB 1380 declares all prohibited local ordinances null and void. CS/SB 1380 was signed by the Governor on June 7, 2022.
