Funding from the Broward Sheriff's Office Law Enforcement Trust Fund helps the Broward County Community Development Corporation (BHS) increase its ability to provide permanent supportive housing opportunities for the most vulnerable by providing rental subsidies for Individuals and Families residing in Broward Housing Solutions' (BHS') owned and operated properties. This program provides permanent, affordable, and supportive housing for homeless or very low-income individuals and families who are disabled and have a diagnosed Severe and Persistent Mental Illness (SPMI). Given that BHS establishes rent at a mere 30% of each client-tenant's monthly income, as opposed to the prevailing market rates for housing, BHS encounters a substantial disparity between the expenses incurred in providing affordable and supportive housing and its rental revenue. This funding assists in bridging this gap, benefiting our residents while simultaneously enabling the organization to expand its programs for additional clients with mental health challenges.

## VI. SUMMARY DESCRIPTION:

With South Florida's aviation industry expected to add more than 20,000 job openings in the next 10 years, it is essential to build a diverse, trained workforce from underrepresented communities that have equitable access to high-paying jobs in aviation. MODS will use LETF funding to support the Museum's Aviation Academy, a paid high school workforce development internship for youth from Broward County Title 1 schools. The Aviation Academy provides leadership development, life skills training and part-time employment at the Museum that encourages youth to pursue college and career pathways in aviation. Youth will participate in 250 hours of workforce experience as Museum aviation educators; symposiums with aviation and STEM professionals; excursions to aviation industries and facilities including CTS Engines, Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport and Kennedy Space Center; and participate in an FAA drone licensing course to receive professional certification in the field. To empower at-risk youth from low-income communities to graduate from high school, pursue college and explore career pathways in growing STEM careers, the Museum of Discovery and Science (MODS) will utilize LETF funding to support Everglades EcoExplorers-a year-long paid high school workforce development internship for 80 atrisk youth in Broward County.
