AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, PERTAINING TO ETHICS; AMENDING SECTION 1-19 OF THE BROWARD COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES ("CODE"); AMENDING SECTION 26-73 OF THE CODE; SUPERSEDING CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Chapter 112, Part III, Florida Statutes, provides a Code of Ethics for Public Officers and Employees ("Florida Code of Ethics"), which applies to members of the Broward County Board of County Commissioners (the "Board"), County employees, and mayors and members of governing bodies of municipalities within Broward County ("Municipal Officials");

WHEREAS, Section 112.326, Florida Statutes, empowers local governments to impose more stringent ethical standards than are provided under the Florida Code of Ethics;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Broward County Charter, the Board enacted Section 1-19 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances, known as the Code of Ethics for Elected Officials ("County Code of Ethics"), which imposes more stringent ethical standards than the Florida Code of Ethics, including more stringent gift limitations;

WHEREAS, the Florida Code of Ethics, in most instances, permits public officials who are subject to its gift limitations to accept gifts worth \$100.00 or less from donors

who lobby or do business with their agencies, thus allowing most public officials to interact with the public in situations where items of nominal value may be exchanged, while still prohibiting sizable gifts that may invite actual or perceived impropriety;

WHEREAS, the stringent gift limitations in the County Code of Ethics unintentionally discourage personal interaction and communication between elected officials and the communities they serve, and under certain circumstances impose unnecessary costs on City and County governments to pay for elected officials' admission to or participation in relevant events that would otherwise not require public expenditure; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds that modifying the County Code of Ethics as provided below will improve understanding of, and compliance with, the law and promote communication and interaction between local governments and the communities they serve, thus strengthening the County Code of Ethics, and further finds that such modification is in the best interest of the County,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Section 1. Section 1-19 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 1-19. Code of ethics for elected officials.

. . .

(c) Standards of Conduct. In addition to the provisions of Chapter 112, Part III, Florida Statutes, Code of Ethics for Public Officers and Employees; Chapters 838 and 839, Florida Statutes; Title 18, Chapter 63 of the United States Code; and Chapter 26,

Article V of the Broward County Code of Ordinances, Section 26-67, et seq., the following Standards of Conduct shall apply to each Elected Official:

(1) Acceptance of gifts.

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No Elected Official or relative, registered domestic partner, or a. governmental office staff of any Elected Official, shall accept any gift, directly or indirectly, any gift of food and/or nonalcoholic beverages with a value in excess of \$25.00 or any other gift with a value in excess of \$5.00, from lobbyists registered with the governmental entity on whose behalf they (or their registered domestic partner or relative) serve, or from any principal or employer of any such registered lobbyist, or from vendors or contractors of such governmental entity. In order to effectuate this provision, no lobbyist shall engage in any lobbying activity prior to registering as a lobbyist with the applicable governmental entity. For purposes of this paragraph, neither Broward County, any municipality within Broward County, nor any other governmental entity shall be considered a registered lobbyist, a principal or employer of a registered lobbyist, or a vendor or contractor of any governmental entity within Broward County.

e. When not otherwise permitted by this part (c)(1), "Acceptance of Gifts," the following items may be accepted to the full extent permissible under state law:

68	1.	Items customarily given to express condolences or sympathy,
69		such as flowers, food items, or cards, given to an Elected
70		Official in connection with the death or significant injury or
71		illness of the Elected Official or an immediate family member
72		of the Elected Official;
73	2.	Training, including the payment or reimbursement of
74		expenses incurred in connection therewith, provided the
75		training relates to the Elected Official's public service. The
76		receipt of such training is deemed to directly benefit the public
77		on whose behalf the Elected Official serves; and
78	3.	Nonalcoholic beverages; and
79	4.	Admission tickets to charitable events available to the public,
80		provided that any Elected Official or governmental office staff
81		of the Elected Official who receives such tickets shall:
82		a. Within fifteen (15) days after receiving such tickets,
83		files for public inspection a disclosure form stating the
84		name of the donor, the value of the tickets received,
85		and the date and location of the event; and
86		b. Within thirty (30) days after the event, reimburses the
87		donor for the value of the food and beverages
88		consumed by the person(s) using the tickets.
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90 Section 2. Section 26-73 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby 91 amended to read as follows: 92 Sec. 26-73. Code of Ethics. 93 Solicitation or Acceptance of Gifts. (a) 94 (1) County employees shall not solicit or accept any gift, regardless of value, in 95 their official capacity as employees, nor shall they solicit or accept any gift 96 in either an official or personal capacity that may be reasonably perceived 97 to be given to encourage or discourage them from taking any action in 98 connection with their County employment. 99 . . . 100 (6) Notwithstanding Section 26-73(a)(1), the office staff of County 101 Commissioners may, with written approval of the County Commissioner for 102 whom the staff member works, accept gifts of food and/or nonalcoholic beverages with a value not greater than \$25.00. 103 104 105 Section 3. Conflicting Earlier Ordinances Superseded. 106 To the extent any provision of this Ordinance, including its manner of enactment 107 by a simple majority vote of the Board, conflicts with Ordinance No. 2010-22, 108 Ordinance No. 2011-19, or Ordinance No. 2015-55, this Ordinance supersedes and 109 amends said earlier ordinances solely to the extent of such conflict. 110 Section 4. Severability. 111 If any portion of this Ordinance is determined by any court to be invalid, the invalid

portion will be stricken, and such striking will not affect the validity of the remainder of this

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Ordinance. If any court determines that this Ordinance, in whole or in part, cannot be legally applied to any individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such determination will not affect the applicability of this Ordinance to any other individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance.

Section 5. Inclusion in the Broward County Code of Ordinances.

It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners that the provisions of this Ordinance become part of the Broward County Code of Ordinances as of the effective date. The sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or such other appropriate word or phrase to the extent necessary to accomplish such intention.

Section 6. Effective Date.

This Ordinance is effective as of the date provided by law.
