Broward Bridge Scholarship Program Annual Report June 6, 2025

Background

The Broward Bridge Scholarship Program was established on October 6, 2020, between Broward County and Broward College to make attending college attainable and affordable for low-income students who are graduates from a Broward County public high school. The intent is to cover the gap between non-loan-based financial aid and tuition fees for identified eligible students. Eligibility criteria include:

- Broward County residents who are a graduate from a Broward County public high school with at least a 2.5 grade point average
- Are enrolled at Broward College in at least 9 credit hours
- Are enrolled at Broward College pursuing an associate or bachelor's degree, or financial aid eligible technical certificate
- Completed at Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
- Are Pell Grant eligible or have demonstrated need through an income at or below the Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed Report (ALICE) sustainability budget
- Have a gap between non-loan financial aid and cost of tuition and fees

Summary

In the most recent spring 2025 term, 21 students have received \$24,965.92 in awards through the Broward Bridge Scholarship Program for attendance at Broward College.

In the previous fall 2024 term, 24 students received \$25,627.39 in awards.

In the current summer 2025 term, 12 students received \$16,881.43.
