1 A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD
2 COUNTY, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE RESILIENT
3 ENVIRONMENT DEPARTMENT TO FILE A LONG-RANGE LOCAL GOVERNMENT
4 FUNDING REQUEST WITH THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL
5 PROTECTION FOR THE BEACH MANAGEMENT FUNDING ASSISTANCE
6 PROGRAM; SUPPORTING PROJECTS FOR WHICH FUNDING IS REQUESTED;
7 CONFIRMING BROWARD COUNTY'S INTENT AND ABILITY TO SERVE AS THE
8 LOCAL SPONSOR AND TO FUND THE APPROPRIATE LOCAL SHARE OF
9 PROJECTS; IDENTIFYING THE SOURCE OF COUNTY SHARE; AND PROVIDING
10 FOR SEVERABILITY AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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12 WHEREAS, public works projects and studies relating to beach erosion control,
13 beach preservation, marine environmental protection, beach management, and hurricane
14 protection are eligible for State of Florida ("State") funding consideration under the
15 provisions of Chapter 161, Florida Statutes;

16 WHEREAS, in order to qualify for State beach management funding, current State
17 policy requires submission of a long-range local government funding request that
18 specifies projects relating to management of beaches or inlets;

19 WHEREAS, beach erosion control projects using compatible materials, including
20 nearshore, offshore, and upland sand, have been, and are planned to be, conducted by

Broward County as the local project sponsor, with subsequent reimbursement of the federal and State shares of eligible costs; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Broward County, Florida ("Board"), has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of Broward County to pursue all available funding in order to restore and maintain the inlets and beaches of Broward County, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Section 1. The Board authorizes and directs the Resilient Environment Department to file a long-range local government funding request with the Florida Department of Environmental Protection pursuant to the Beach Management Funding Assistance Program for Fiscal Year 2026-2027.

Section 2. The Board supports the (i) postconstruction physical and biological monitoring, permit-required beach tilling, mitigation reef construction, and project permitting for Segment II of the Broward County Shore Protection Project; (ii) postconstruction physical and biological monitoring, permit-required beach tilling, and dune construction for Segment III of the Broward County Shore Protection Project; and (iii) preconstruction physical and biological monitoring, during-construction monitoring, and sand trap, jetty, and mitigation reef construction for the Port Everglades Sand Bypass Project (collectively, "Projects") for which funding is requested from the State.

Section 3. Broward County intends and is able to serve as the local project sponsor for the Projects and intends and is able to provide the appropriate local funding share from beach capital funds to implement the Projects.

Section 4. Severability.

If any portion of this Resolution is determined by any court to be invalid, the invalid portion will be stricken, and such striking will not affect the validity of the remainder of this Resolution. If any court determines that this Resolution, in whole or in part, cannot be legally applied to any individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such determination will not affect the applicability of this Resolution to any other individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance.

Section 5. Effective Date.

This Resolution is effective upon adoption.
