2. Section 3 is hereby amended to replace the reference to “Contract No. JH343” with “Contract No. JHME2.”
3. Section 35 is hereby amended to add Paragraphs h. – j. as follows:
  - h. Nutritional Programs. Nutritional Programs and Activities funded through DCF’s Office of Economic Self-Sufficiency requires that the Provider and its subcontractors comply with USDA Food & Nutrition Service Instruction FNS-113-1 to ensure civil rights compliance and to prohibit discrimination in nutrition programs and activities.

- i. Drug Free Workplace. If the Provider is a subrecipient or pass-through entity of federal funds originating from HHS, the Provider must comply with drug-free workplace requirements in Subpart B (or Subpart C, if the recipient is an individual) of 2 CFR part 382, which adopts the governmentwide implementation (2 CFR Part 182) of sec. 5152-5158 of the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988 (Pub. L. 100-690, Title V, Subtitle D; 41 U.S.C. 701-707).
  - j. Confidential Client and Other Information. The Provider shall maintain the confidentiality of all confidential data, files, and records related to deliverables and comply with all state and federal laws, including, §§471(a)(8) of the Social Security Act, 106(b)(2)(B) of the Child Abuse Prevention and Treatment Act, 7 U.S.C. §2020(e)(8), 42 U.S.C. §602, 2 CFR §200.303, 2 CFR §200.337, 7 CFR §272.1(c), 42 CFR §§2.1-2.3, 42 CFR §§431.300-306, and 45 CFR §205. Summaries of Florida Statutes providing for confidentiality of this and other information are found in Part II of the Attorney General's Government in the Sunshine Manual.
4. Section 15, entitled "Intellectual Property" is amended to require that any interest, benefit, or indemnification extended to BBHC related to the intellectual property referenced therein, shall also run to the interest, benefit, or indemnification of DCF. If Provider is a governmental entity entitled to sovereign immunity pursuant to §768.28, Florida Statutes, nothing herein is intended to waive sovereign immunity to the extent it applies to Provider as a governmental entity. However, to the extent required by law, as a governmental entity, Provider shall remain responsible for any liability arising related to or arising from the intellectual property arising from and as described in Paragraph 15, but shall not be required to indemnify BBHC or DCF.
