The BrowardNext Steering Committee recommended that the amendment be expedited to comply with Florida Statutes.

- II. Planning Council Staff Transmittal Recommendation November 24, 2025

It is recommended that the proposed amendment to the BrowardNext - Broward County Land Use Plan be approved. **See Attachment 1.**

As the Planning Council is aware, the Broward County Charter requires at least one Planning Council public hearing and Article 1.2(A) of the *Administrative Rules Document: BrowardNext* outlines the following circumstances in which a second Planning Council public hearing may be recommended or required:

- (1) At its initial public hearing, the Planning Council takes an action to recommend denial of a proposed amendment; or
- (2) At its initial public hearing, the Planning Council takes an action to recommend approval subject to meeting specific criteria or policy prior to a second Planning Council public hearing; or
- (3) At its initial public hearing, the Planning Council votes by a majority of the members present with a minimum of six (6) affirmative votes for a second Planning Council public hearing; or
- (4) If the County Commission requests by a vote of the majority of members present to request a second Planning Council public hearing; or
- (5) If an objection or comment on adverse impacts to important state resources or facilities is issued during the State of Florida Chapter 163 review process; or
- (6) If State of Florida Chapter 163 requires or is modified to require a second local planning agency public hearing.

**If the Planning Council chooses to require a second Planning Council public hearing per Article 1.2(A)(1)(2) or (3), such recommendation must be made as part of its motion.**

**BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

Upon review of the 2025 State of Florida legislative changes, Planning Council staff was advised by the Broward County Office of the County Attorney that BrowardNext – Broward County Land Use Plan Policies 2.36.1 and 2.36.2 regarding Environmental Justice conflict with Senate Bill 2502, enacted on July 1, 2025.

The proposed text amendment was initiated as part of the BrowardNext update process and Planning Council staff was directed by the BrowardNext Steering Committee to expedite said amendment at its October 16, 2025, meeting.

**RELATIONSHIP TO FLORIDA STATUTES**

Planning Council staff finds that the proposed amendment is necessary to comply with Florida law.

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#### **ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE**

**POLICY 2.36.1**      ~~For local and regional land use policy and public infrastructure and services decisions, local governments and agencies should ensure environmental justice when considering the impacts to vulnerable populations, including but not limited to, the economically disadvantaged, racial and ethnic minorities, the uninsured, low income children, the elderly, the homeless and those with chronic health conditions, including severe mental illness.~~

**POLICY 2.36.2**      ~~The Broward County Planning Council and Broward County shall, by 2019, work with Broward County municipalities, partner agencies, stakeholders, and interested parties who make and are affected by land use policy and public infrastructure and services decisions, and issue model guidelines, methods, and tools to advance environmental justice.~~

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
